Purpose

The Provost Scholars will visit Chateau Hough, a vineyard and inner city garden in the Hough neighborhood started by Mr. Mansfield Frazier. Mr. Frazier started his vineyard on three-quarters of an acre between an abandoned home, a long-shuttered library, and a vacant corner store with 14 rows of vines. The Scholars will tour Mr. Frazier's vineyard and learn how he has helped transform a segment of his community with gardening, employment, and community engagement.

Presenter Biography



Mr. Mansfield Frazier is in his early 70s and oversees and manages a vineyard in Cleveland's Hough neighborhood. He has garnered years of experience and dramatically transformed his life after serving three years in the American federal prison system in the mid-1990s. Reflecting on his experiences in prison, he published *From Behind the Wall*, a book on America's correctional system and race relations. Since publishing his book, he has leveraged his writing and civic connections to become a leader in Cleveland's African-American community. He regularly contributes to Cool Cleveland, a local online publication; hosts a local radio show; and publishes *Reentry Advocate*, a magazine focused on the successful return of prisoners to society. One of his greatest successes is Chateau Hough, a vineyard and 'biocellar' set on reclaimed land. Biocellars are transformed basements of abandoned homes used to house solar greenhouses. The vineyard was started with a \$15,000 grant from the city and \$8,000 from Mr. Frazier's

savings. His goal is to beautify the lot and generate employment for jobseekers reentering the workforce. More details about his work can be found here: http://chateauhough.org/news-events/.
