Presenter Biography



Dr. Karen Beckwith is the Flora Stone Mather Professor and Chair of the Department of Political Science at Case Western Reserve University (CWRU). She received her B.A. from the University of Kentucky (1972) and her M.A. and Ph.D. from Syracuse University (1977, 1982). Teaching primarily in the areas of political parties, political movements, and women, gender, and politics, she has special interests in the United States and West Europe, particularly Britain and Italy. Professor Beckwith's current research includes projects on 1) how social movements respond to loss; 2) gendered competition in party leadership contests in parliamentary democracies; and 3) patterns of women's appointments to cabinet posts in North America and West Europe. She has been awarded numerous distinctions for her research projects, and is an accomplished speaker, editor, and author in her areas of study.
