Ruqaiijah A. Yearby is the Oliver C. Schroeder Jr. Distinguished Research Scholar, Professor of Law, and Associate Director of the Law-Medicine Center at Case Western Reserve University School of Law. A nationally and internationally recognized scholar and presenter, Professor Yearby's scholarship focuses on two emerging fields of health law: 1) racial disparities in health care and 2) law, justice and medical research. She recently presented her work on law, justice and medical research at the Oxford Global Health and Bioethics International Conference in Oxford, England. Based on her expertise, she has served as a book proposal reviewer for Oxford University Press and Cambridge University Press. Her scholarship has also been used in law and social science classes at institutions such as New York University. Fordham University, and the

University of California, Berkeley. Professor Yearby is a prolific writer and has received accolades for her scholarly works.
