 - A. Discussion re: the Revised SAC Constitution
 - i. On Page 2 under Section 5: Rules for Election of Officers:
 - 1. Language added: "Nominees must be current elected members of the Council."
 - 2. Officer election date to be added (elections to take place at April SAC General Council Meeting)



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ii. The Elections Committee was asked to create an online ballot in order to approve suggested amendments to the SAC Constitution. (Note: an email dated 4/23/15 was sent by SAC President to SAC representatives asking them to participate in a vote by Friday, May 1, 2015.

V. Presentations:

Tobacco-Free Campus Initiative (Elizabeth Click, Medical Director)

- Elizabeth gave an overview of how the Initiative has evolved over the past 2 years; during Spring semester 2015, 3 subcommittees met weekly for 6 weeks; the committee included 25 faculty, staff and students
- Policy has been edited down to one page; it has been a collaborative campus process that focuses on cessation in a supportive environment
- Compliance language: focuses on the positive, but plan is to use the disciplinary protocols through the Office of Student Conduct (for students) and Employee Relations (for faculty and staff)
- A color-coded map, indicating where tobacco use is prohibited, was developed for the appendix area of the policy, with a note that individuals are asked to refrain from tobacco use on public sidewalks
- Implementation will focus on training& education over a period of time
- There has been discussion about safety at the perimeter of campus, as well as the need to communicate with special student populations who are more likely to smoke (international students)
- E-cigarettes will be included in the definition of "tobacco"
- In regards to individuals' rights: "smokers" are not considered a "protected group" on campus and smoking is not a protected liberty right.
- No part of the policy includes language that would prohibit hiring of people who smoke or making university admissions decisions based on whether the student smokes; this is NOT part of the current conversation
- Legalization of marijuana is also NOT part of the current conversation

SAC members were asked to vote regarding support of the Tobacco-Free Campus: PASSED by majority.

VI. Reports of Standing Committees

The Communications committee met on 3/12 and 4/14. We are working on creating a list of guidelines for use of the constituency email list servs. This will allow us to narrow our focus



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with emails, as the intent for our messages is to be relevant to staff rather than an alternative other methods of communication (e.g. The Daily). We have published the March newsletter and asked that it be sent out to our constituents. Starting in the next quarterly newsletter (June), we are going to add an information column that will expand upon the current "Did You Know?" section, where overlapping information across the university will be pulled into one place. Our goal is to unify communication and make it easier for staff to know what is offered on a particular topic (i.e. Professional Development, Women's events, etc.). We met with Terminal 4 and they have provided help with the transfer of our current website. They will be working with us and University Marketing & Communications to bring the site to live production within the next couple of months. We are working with the chairs of each SAC committee to develop an annual report of our 2014 successes and future plans for 2015.  INFORMATION ABOUT VOLUNTEERING AT THE CLEVELAND FOOD BANK

Greater Cleveland Food Bank is located at: 15500 S. Waterloo Road, Cleveland. It is about 5 miles west from the University, pretty much a straight shot down Euclid Avenue.

It is a food distribution center to more than 750 local food pantries, shelters, etc. as well as a kitchen where meals are prepared and served. Volunteers can request working in the packing/distribution center or in the kitchen.

They are open Monday-Thursday 8:30 am - 8:00 pm and they schedule volunteers in two hour shifts beginning at 8:30, 10, 12, 2, 4, & 6. Fridays they close at 2 pm.

They have a public calendar for individual volunteers but like to pre-schedule, at least a week in advance, groups of 3 to 20. A group can volunteer once or multiple times.

Volunteers are on their feet for the two hours. Comfortable clothing and shoes are recommended. Closed toe and heel shoes are required. There is a little lifting involved and if one works in the kitchen one is asked not to wear fingernail polish and limit the amount of jewelry worn.

Once a group is determined we would make arrangements by calling Chris at 216-738-2069.

Hope this is enough information needed by the group to decide if this is something in which they are interested in participating.

If we are looking for a Spring activity perhaps this is something we could do every Tuesday in April (or something like that).

- 4. Specified that elections will be completed by August 1st each year.
- 5. Eliminated term limits—i.e., members can run for re-election every two years.
- 6. Specified that a member who resigns cannot run again for two years.
- 7. Added language about SAC Chair receiving feedback on submitted recommendations within one month.
