

Donald Carrier is the director of Case Western Reserve University and Cleveland Play House's Master of Fine Arts in Acting program. He is an actor, teacher and director who has worked extensively in theater and film across North America.

He spent nine seasons at the Stratford

Festival playing leading roles in *As You Like It, The Importance of Being Earnest, Twelfth Night, Coriolanus, The Merchant of Venice* and *Measure for Measure,* among many others. He spent three seasons at the Old Globe under renowned director Adrian Noble where credits included *Amadeus, Taming of the Shrew, The Merchant of Venice, Much Ado About Nothing, King Lear* and *The Tempest.*

He also spent two seasons at the Shaw Festival. He has worked at the Shakespeare Theatre, Studio Theatre, the Huntington Theatre, the Chicago Shakespeare Theatre, the Intiman Theatre, the Great Lakes Theatre, the Wilma Theatre, Notre Dame Shakespeare Festival, The National Arts Center, CanStage, Maltz Jupiter Theatre and TheatreWorks among many others.
