Florence Harkness Memorial Chapel

Harkness Chapel (est. 1902), features neo-Gothic architecture, antique oak and Georgia pine woodwork, and Tiffany windows. It is a warm, intimate, and acoustically resonant space for the performance of vocal and instrumental chamber music. The building provides space for concerts, music classes, and department recitals. It was built to honor Florence Harkness Severance (Louis Henry Severance), the only daughter of Stephen V. Harkness, and his second wife, Anna M. Richardson Harkness.

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ABOUT THE CONCERTO COMPETITION

Each spring, CWRU undergraduate students compete in the Concerto Competition for an opportunity to perform as a soloist with Symphony Orchestra or Symphonic Winds. This competition is open to all CWRU undergraduate music majors who are full time students at the sophomore or junior (or seniors planning a 5th year) level, who are taking applied music lessons, and enrolled in a department primary ensemble during the semester of the competition and the performance. Repertoire can be selected from the concerto or double concerto repertoire, smaller solo works, or representative vocal works with orchestral/chamber accompaniment. Repertoire is selected in advance and approved by the Director of Orchestras (Dr. Kathleen Horvath). The competition recital is held in late March and the winner(s) perform the following academic year.
