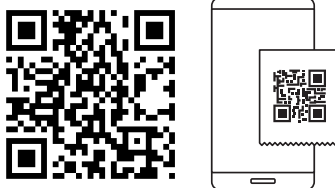

Outside of music, Michael is the President of the Case Engineers Council, which is a social and professional engineer organization that helps with planning CWRU's celebration of National Engineers Week in February. He is also a member of Tau Beta Pi, a professional Engineering Honor Society. In his free time, Michael likes to collect books and write, and self-published his first novel in 2021. Michael is honored to perform with the Orchestra tonight, and hopes that the audience will enjoy this rendition of the Glazunov Concerto.

Grant Carr is a third-year music and economics major at Case Western Reserve University studying piano with Dr. Sean Schulze (CIM). He has diverse musical tastes, from Bach to Radiohead to Pusha T. Grant likes playing Totentanz because the piece is so "expressive, beautiful, and technically challenging". Liszt had a reputation for showmanship; in Grant's words, he was "a 19th Century Ozzie Osbourne." Grant grew up in Tacoma, WA.
