ABOUT THE DEPARTMENT OF MUSIC

The Department of Music serves undergraduate and graduate students at Case Western Reserve University and all students at the Cleveland Institute of Music through our Joint Music Program. Our program stimulates the highest standards in academic and artistic excellence by offering a broad range of degree programs, courses, and ensemble experiences with faculty specializing in historical performance practice, music education, and musicology. Our campus (located in the heart of University Circle) provides a thriving and holistic learning experience where students feel comfortable in a diverse and supportive environment.

The Bachelor of Arts (BA) in Music is for students who want to major in music while receiving a comprehensive, liberal arts education. Many undergraduate students combine musical study with another area of study through a double major or dual degree. The BA in Music offers excellent preparation for graduate work in music or professional studies in other fields.

The Bachelor of Science (BS) in Music Education is a professional degree for students interested in teaching music within K-12 schools. This program guides students through sequential instruction, critical thinking, and practical teaching experiences, ultimately leading to teaching licensure.

Our graduate programs provide rigorous academic study and professional training in the fields of musicology, historical performance practice, and music education, and help prepare the next generation of leaders in these fields.

For students who want to participate in musical activities on campus, our many ensembles are open to all CWRU students regardless of major and music lessons are offered through the JMP with CIM faculty (instructional fees apply).



CONDUCTOR AND MUSIC DIRECTOR

Dr. Ryan V. Scherber is Assistant Professor of Music Education and Director of Bands at Case Western Reserve University. His duties include teaching music education coursework at the undergraduate and graduate level, field observations of student teachers, and oversight of the CWRU Bands program. In addition to his duties with CWRU, Dr. Scherber serves as Instructor of Tuba and Euphonium within the Joint Music Program between Case Western Reserve University and the Cleveland Institute of Music as well as Assistant Director of the Florida State University Summer Music Camps. Scherber holds the Bachelor of Music in Music Education from the University of Cincinnati, College-Conservatory of Music (CCM) as well as the Master of Music and Ph.D. in Music Education from Florida State University (FSU).

FEATURED SOLOIST

Mr. Jeremy Gray is currently a third-year double major in music and biology at Case Western Reserve University and studies with Daniel Gilbert at the Cleveland Institute of Music. Since the beginning of his clarinet journey in the fourth grade, Gray has played in numerous ensembles such as the principal clarinetist in the Asian American Youth Symphony, AAYS woodwind quintet, Los Angeles Junior Chamber Music, and the woodwind captain of the West High School Marching Band. At CWRU, Gray has played as principal clarinet of Symphonic Winds, is an active member of the Case/University Circle Symphony Orchestra, as well as CWRU's woodwind quintet. Outside of performance, Gray has previously won the D.K Kim Music Scholarship and is currently the Vice President of the music fraternity on campus, Mu Phi Epsilon. Jeremy would like to give a huge thank you to his current teacher, Daniel Gilbert, as well as all of his past and present music educators that have shaped him into the musician he is today.
