Florence Harkness Memorial Chapel

Harkness Chapel (est. 1902) sits in the center of Mather Quad. It is the primary venue for Department of Music concerts, recitals, and special events. Design features include neo-Gothic architecture, antique oak and Georgia pine woodwork, and Tiffany windows. The performance hall features a warm, intimate, and acoustically resonant space best suited for vocal and instrumental chamber music, ample seating for up to 400 guests, and built-in sound amplification with audio/video recording and livestream capabilities. Harkness Chapel was built to honor Florence Harkness Severance (Louis Henry Severance), the only daughter of Stephen V. Harkness and his second wife, Anna M. Richardson Harkness.

FACILITY GUIDELINES



INSTRUCTOR, DIRECTOR OF CHOIRS

Dr. Christopher L. Clark, PhD, is the Director of Choirs at Case Western Reserve University in Cleveland Heights, Ohio. He received his PhD from The University of Hartford's Hartt School of Music, and a double Masters in Music Education and Choral Conducting from Bowling Green State University. Dr. Clark has taught for 15 years in public school systems in Ohio and Massachusetts, most recently as Director of Vocal Music at the Southern Berkshire Regional School District in Sheffield, Massachusetts, teaching grades 3-12. Dr. Clark's research interests include the intersection of choral music educators and their religiosity, group choral improvisation, and social justice. A 2013 Yale "Distinguished Music Educator", Dr. Clark performs with Boston-based social justice choir, Voices 21C, and is a frequent guest clinician, soloist, and presenter.

Jessica L. G. Steuver [STY-ver], she/her, is proud to serve as the Instructor of Record of University Chorale. Originally from South Euclid, OH, Jessica is a full-time PhD Candidate in Music Education at Case Western Reserve University and also serves as the Instructor of Record of Voice Skills & Pedagogy. Her research interests include intersectional feminism in music, LGBTQ+ studies, musical catharsis, and mental health and choral participation post-pandemic. Jessica holds degrees from Bowling Green State University (BM) and University of Cincinnati, College-Conservatory of Music (MM). In addition to her graduate work at CWRU, Jessica serves as the Artistic Director of Windsong, Cleveland's Feminist Chorus, a community treble ensemble rooted in social justice, activism, and the empowerment that comes from finding one's own voice.
