He is a 2022 graduate of the UNC School of the Arts High School, where he studied cello with Dr. Brooks Whitehouse. At UNCSCA, he performed in orchestras conducted by Xian Zhang, Thomas Wilkins, and Larry Rachleff. He graduates from Case Western Reserve University in May 2026, with a BA degree in both Music (cello) and Political Science, also completing three minors: Public Policy, Economics, and Ethics. He will continue graduate studies in the Master of Public Administration program at James Madison University.

At CWRU, Noah performed with the University Circle Symphony Orchestra for three years, participated in chamber music, and served as an executive member of the student MUSIC club. He was inducted into CWRU's Mortar Board and Phi Sigma Tau chapters, was awarded the Phi Beta Kappa Prize in 2024, was a Civic Engagement Scholar for two years, and earned Dean's High Honors each semester.
