BY THE NUMBERS

National Network

We support a national network of over 5,000 women in higher education and engaged with 743 women in leadership conferences and webinars this year.

80/54/7

Our Women's Staff Leadership Development Institute provided 80 hours of professional development including 54 hours of Weatherhead coursework to 7 participants.

160

Cleveland Metropolitan School District scholars completed STEM education and goal setting workshops.

200 Hours of mentoring provided to 68 first year women.

We awarded 27 research and professional development grants totaling \$34,788 to undergraduate, graduate, and staff/faculty.





