Sudi Harbool is a sophomore, double-majoring in Biology and Psychology and minoring in French, Social Justice and Chemistry. Sudi is involved in research at Case Western Reserve University as well as volunteering with local healthcare providers

Anvitha Ravipati is a doctoral candidate in Sociology. Prior to coming to CWRU, she worked extensively on projects with women farmers in India; she continues that work in her dissertation while adding work with local Cleveland women farmers as well. Anvitha's work demonstrates the central role women play globally in sustainable agricultural practice, and such work drives an increase in support for these farmers and their efforts. Anvitha was also previously selected as a Freedman Student Fellow through the Kelvin Smith Library and is currently a Graduate Research Assistant with the Mary Ann Swetland Center for Environmental Health.
