## Faculty Profile Robert D. Heckel, DMD, Clinical Associate Professor



After completing his undergraduate studies at The Ohio State University, Robert Heckel earned his dental degree at CWRU. Upon graduation from dental school, he served for four years in the U.S. Navy, attached to the submarine force Atlantic Fleet. Dr. Heckel then attended the

graduate School of Medicine at the University of Pennsylvania, followed by an internship at Grady Memorial Hospital and Emory University in Atlanta. His OMFS residency was at Charity Hospital of Louisiana and Louisiana State University in New Orleans. Dr. Heckel also did a complete medical anesthesiology residency at University Hospitals of Cleveland.

For the next four decades, Dr. Heckel was in private practice in the Warren-Youngstown, Ohio area, where he served three terms as the chairman of the Department of Surgery (that included all medical specialties) at St. Joseph Hospital, as well as three terms as the president of the medical staff. In addition, he served on the board of trustees for the Humility of Mary Corporation that operated St. Joseph and two other hospitals (now known as Mercy Health).

Always active in his specialty, Dr. Heckel served as president of the Great Lakes Society of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons. For seven years, he was an examiner for the American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery and was a site visitor for program accreditation for the Council on Dental Education (CODA).

In 2005, Dr. Heckel joined the faculty at the request of Dean Jerry Goldberg, and current department chair, Dr. Dale Baur, is grateful for the depth of experience he continues to bring to the program. Dr. Heckel is at CWRU from June through November and spends the remaining months at his Ft. Meyers, Florida home.

"I do this for a simple reason—because I like it," notes Dr. Heckel. "I hope the residents get as much out of it as I do."
