EHS must have these documents on file in order to approve any grants and/or the purchase of radiological, biological or chemical agents.

By reviewing the enclosed documents and attending required training, your lab will be compliant with the federal requirements issued by OSHA, EPA, CDC, USDA, DOT, IATA and other government agencies. It is important to note, this is a *general* packet and therefore, other requirements may apply to your specific lab.
