7 p.m. Ice Cream Social at Michell's Uptown (E3)

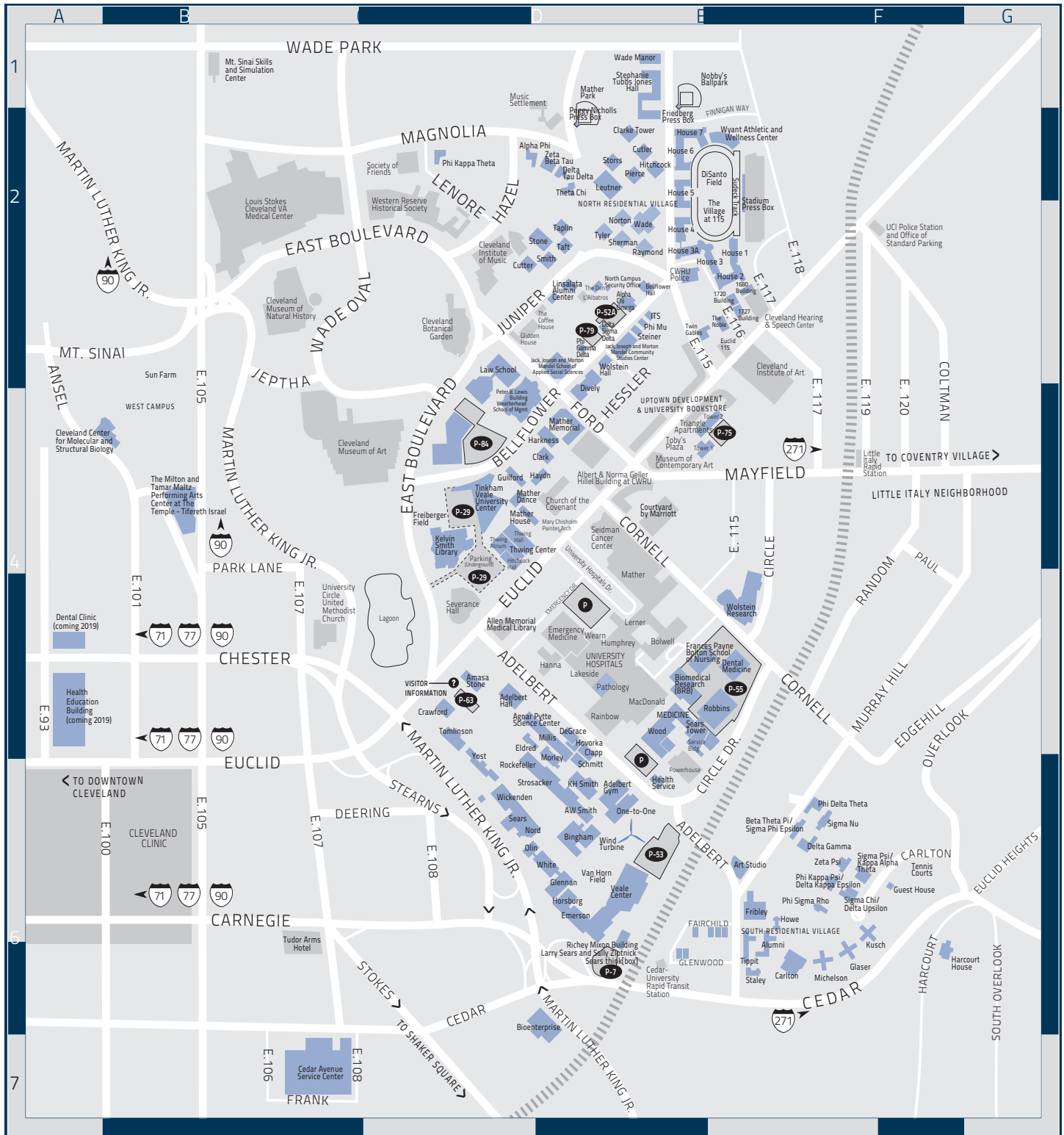
8 p.m. Game Night with Residence Life Wade Commons (E2)
