- Improve job opportunities upon graduation through acquired skills and networking connections

Logistics

•Eligibility

- All Engineering and Computer Science students
- Students who have completed 4 semesters of coursework (can start co-op as early as the summer before junior year)
- Good academic standing and have a min GPA of 2.5
- Approval from faculty advisor
- Students can complete 1 or 2 co-op rotations
- •Status and Financial Aid
 - Maintain full time student status
 - Financial Aid and scholarships can be deferred






