


Employability Trends: Global Skills



-QS Global Employability Trends 2011:Global Skills Gaps and Mismatched Expectations





Study Abroad: A Competitive Edge

- > 90% -97% landed a job within first 6 months to one year of graduation
- > 90% of Alumni got into their 1st or 2nd choice of graduate school
- 80% reported better able to adapt to diverse work environments
- > 97% reported study abroad increased maturity

Study Abroad: Academics



- Courses available in English
- Courses count towards degree
- Courses are approved by prior to going abroad

Study Abroad: Housing

- Depends on program type: Short-term or long-term
 - University on-campus housing
 - University affiliated off-campus housing
 - Host family
 - Hotel
- Short-Term Programs:
 - Hotel, host family, or program affiliated housing
 - Housing is typically included in the program fee for faculty-led programs

Study Abroad: Housing

Long-Term Programs:

- Arrange housing with host university, or program provider
- Withdraw from CWRU housing for the term abroad
- Students pay room, board, and any additional fees to host university
- Students will not pay room or board to CWRU during the term(s) abroad



Study Abroad: Cost

Semester/Academic Year

- Cost Neutral: Students continue to pay tuition to CWRU at their current tuition rate (including all aid)
- CWRU Exchange programs: Students pay tuition to CWRUU. Student do not pay tuition to the host institution
- Non-Exchange Programs: CWRU will pay tuition only to the foreign institution (on behalf of the student) for semester-long programs that are not "exchanges".

Study Abroad: Cost Faculty-led Programs

- > Students pay tuition and a program fee to CWRU
- Cost Varies by program
- Cost typically Includes housing, some excursions, ground transportation
- Airfare and most meals are not included in program fee
- > Students Earn three (3) CWRU credits



Study Abroad: Cost

Summer Programs

- Students pay tuition or program fee directly to host institution or third-party study abroad program provider
- Students pay room, board, and any additional fees directly to their host institution or program provider


Study Abroad: Funding

- Use grants and financial aid (Federal financial aid can be used for tuition, program fees, and other courserelated expenses)
- Use <u>scholarships</u>



Study Abroad: Funding/Scholarships

- Over 65 scholarship resources available at case.edu/studyabroad
- Award amounts vary
- Need-based and Meritbased



Study Abroad: Funding/Scholarships

- National Scholarships
- Benjamin Gilman Scholarship awards up to \$8,000
- o Freeman-Asia Scholarship awards \$3,000-\$7,000
- Boren Scholarship- National Security Education Program awards up to \$20,000
- Program Specific Scholarships
- o IES Abroad awards up to \$3,000
- The Council on International Educational Exchange (CIEE) award amounts vary

Study Abroad: Risk Management

Study Abroad: Risk Management

- Study Abroad Application is required
- Health & Safety/Academic & Cultural pre-departure orientation
- International health insurance & travel insurance provided (no additional cost)
- Travel advisories (U.S. State Dept., CDC, etc.)
- Resources available at host university/program provider

Study Abroad: Application Process

Semester/Academic year programs

- Research programs & meet with advisors
- ✓ Complete CWRU study abroad application
- ✓ Apply to host institution/program abroad
- ✓ Get accepted by host university/program abroad
- ✓ Attend pre-departure orientation
- Obtain travel documents (visa, passport, etc.)
- ✓ Apply for housing abroad
- ✓ Obtain physical exam and required vaccines



Study Abroad: Application Process

Short-term Faculty-led programs

- ✓ Research programs & meet with faculty program leader
- ✓ Complete CWRU study abroad application
- ✓ Attend pre-departure orientation
- ✓ Obtain travel documents (visa, passport, etc.)
- ✓ Obtain any required vaccinations

Study Abroad: Applications Due

Short-Term/Faculty-led

Winter Break: Last day of Fall Add/Drop (Sept. 4^{th)}
Spring Break/Spring (May Abroad): Last Day of Spring Add/Drop
(January 22nd)

Long-Term Study Abroad

Fall or Academic Year: March 1st

Spring or Calendar Year: September 15th

Summer Study Abroad

Summer: March 15th
