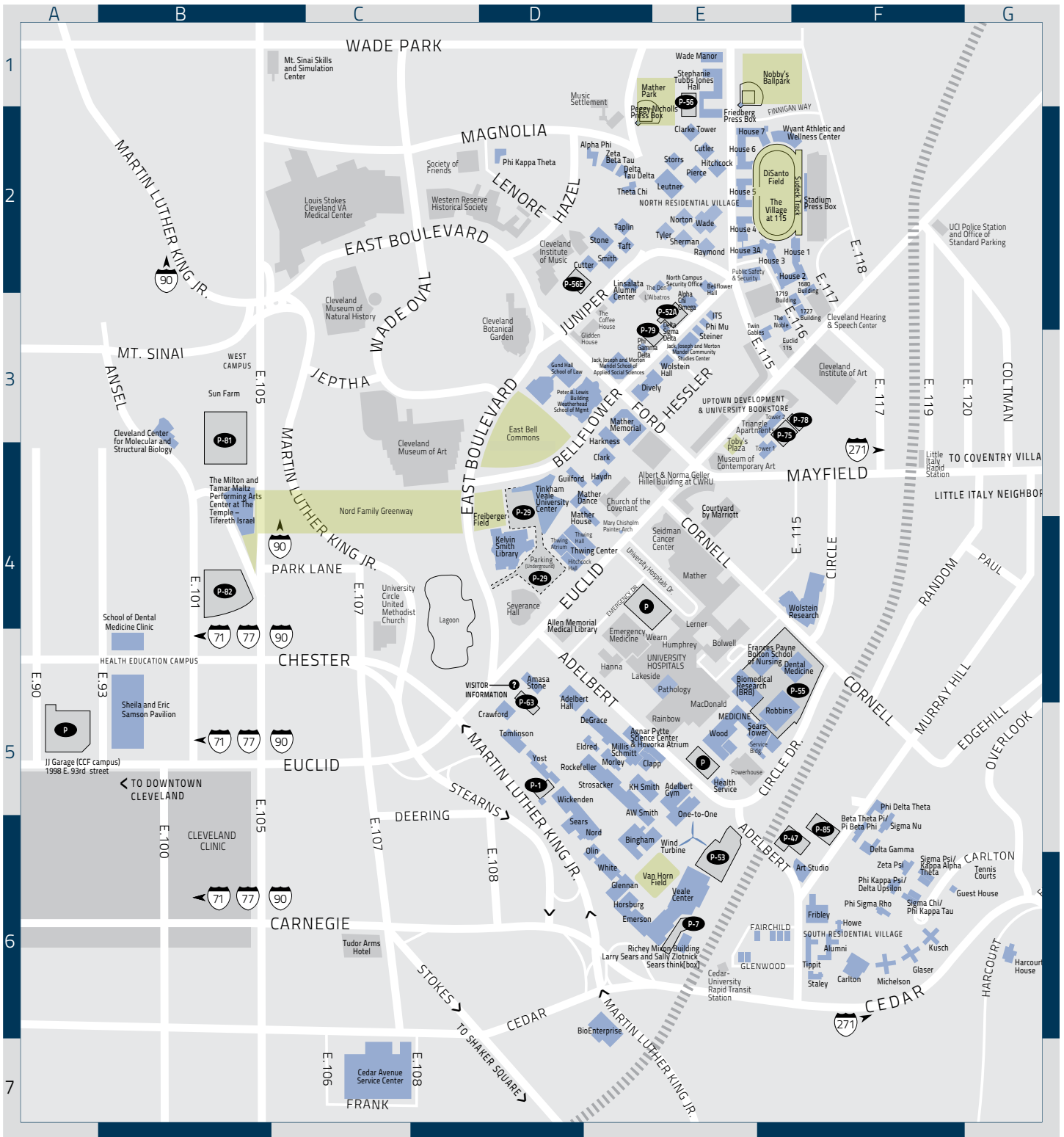
2 p.m. Chemistry Proficiency Exam (optional) Clapp 201 (D5)
