Capital University and Notre Dame College Alum Lawrence "DJ" Perry first got involved with NYSP as a middle school student at Kirk Junior High in East Cleveland during the early nineties. "The defining moment is seeing the program as a student when it was like four sports to how Coach Harris took over--the vision that he had--I couldn't believe what he had done with the program." Inspired by this vision, DJ went on to be a NYSP staff member for thirteen years. Dennis "Coach" Harris - NYSP Director

Coach Dennis Harris did not play football at John F. Kennedy high school. However, he did play wide receiver for the Ohio State Buckeyes from 1977 through 1979. He played two years under the exceptional coaching of legendary Coach Woody Hayes, and then one year under Coach Earl Bruce. During this time, the team played against Alabama in the '78 Sugar Bowl, Clemson in the '78 Gator Bowl, and USC in the '80 Rose Bowl. In addition to his prestigious football career, Coach Harris worked hard scholastically earning his Bachelors in History.
