Brief Description of Institution

Case Western Reserve University is one of the leading private research universities in the United States. Located in Cleveland, Ohio, CWRU offers a unique combination of forward-thinking educational opportunities in an inspiring cultural setting. Our leading-edge faculty engage in teaching and research in a collaborative, hands-on environment. CWRU's nationally recognized programs include arts and sciences, dental medicine, engineering, law, management, medicine, nursing, and social work.

The student body includes about 6,500 undergraduate and 6,000 graduate and professional students. Among the university's nearly 2,000 international students are representatives of more than 130 countries. CWRU has more than 110,000 alumni across the U.S. and around the globe.

Case Western Reserve receives approximately \$400 million annually in funding for research. Key interdisciplinary research areas identified as priorities in the strategic plan include human health and infectious disease; advanced materials; energy and the environment; exploring the nature of innovation through the study of culture, creativity, and design; and social justice and ethics. This category may include Research Professors, Research Associate Professors, Research Assistant Professors, Research Fellows, Research Associates, Research Scientists, Postdoctoral Fellows, or equivalent academic positions. This category excludes PhD Students, Administrative Staff, Technical Staff, Laboratory technicians, Research Assistants, Librarians, Adjunct Professors, Visiting Scholars.

refers to the charges levied by the institution for educational services provided to students or other learners, including tuition fees for degree programs at the undergraduate, master's, and doctoral levels; fees for continuing education and vocational training; admission or application fees; examination fees; and other student-related charges.

-D1.1.3 Of which was derived from research activities

refers to the income generated by the institution from research activities and related support activities, including governmental research grants, industry-sponsored research funding, revenues from research contracts, technical service fees, and other research-related income.

-D1.1.4 Of which was derived from donations and endowments

refers to funds received by the institution or institutional endowment from individuals, corporations, foundations, alumni organizations, or other external entities, with no restrictions or only limited restrictions on their use. This excludes revenues from investments of endowment funds.

-D1.1.5 Of which was derived from self-operating activities and investments

refers to the revenues generated by the institution through self-operating activities, service provision, investments (including investments of endowment funds), and the management or utilization of institutional assets. This category includes revenue from auxiliary services (housing, dining, and student health services) and intellectual property licensing (royalties, trademarks and patents), as well as returns on assets such as interest, dividends and rent. This excludes revenues generated by affiliated or majority-owned entities that operate as independent legal structures, such as the operating revenues of affiliated hospitals and the consolidated earnings of wholly-owned or majority-owned subsidiaries.
