World Class

Our international law program holds a proud place — Ranked number 10 in *U.S. News and World Report* and in the A+ tier by *PreLaw* magazine. Our globally renowned faculty, trend-setting curriculum, and plentiful opportunities for hands-on experience keep us solidly at the forefront of international legal education.

Save Your Euros

Our \$5 million Frederick K. Cox International Law Center endowment enables us to provide grants to more than 20 students every year for their international travel and living expenses. You're eligible for Cox grants for your first summer and your second summer, and during your third-year capstone. We want every graduate of our international law program to have hands-on experience in the field and do our utmost to make it possible.

Concurent JD/LLM Degree

Concurrent degree programs with prestigious partner universities in London, Paris, and Madrid can elevate your third year of law school into a joint JD/LLM program—for the same tuition, and time investment, as your CWRU JD degree. An LLM is an invaluable asset in this area of law.

Take a Deep Dive

Our 35 international law professors teach an extensive array of international law courses, from International Trade to International Environmental Law, from International Business Law to Human Rights Law, and from International Arbitration to International Criminal Law. We offer International Law as a 1L elective. We have two international law journals and two international law clinics. And students who focus on international law may graduate with an international law concentration, a distinction that can open doors in this exciting field.

While in law school, Douglas was the captain of the Vis International Commercial Arbitration Moot Court team, twice earning the best oralist awards at the international competition in Vienna, Austria. He also served as the Executive Articles Editor for the Journal of International Law. During his first summer, Douglas was a judicial extern at the U.S. Court of International Trade, and during his second summer, he was a summer associate at Squire Patten Boggs. During his third year, Douglas attended Université Paris-Dauphine as part of CWRU's concurrent degree program and received a Master 2 with honors in European and International Business Law. After graduating, Douglas joined Squire Patton Boggs, where he acts as counsel in both international arbitrations and international investment treaty arbitrations around the world. He is fluent in French and often works in that language.

CWRU offers the only international law program with a radio voice. Our "Talking Foreign Policy" airs on Cleveland's NPR station, 89.7 FM and is available as a podcast. Recent topics: the Afghanistan Debacle and the International Indictment of Vladimir Putin.

Vinning tradition

Our Jessup International Law Moot Court team is one of just a handful of U.S. teams to have won the world championship and world's best brief award. In 2023, the team won the regional rounds, was ranked 2nd best team and won the 3rd best brief award at the international rounds, and won the best oralist in the world award for the second year in a row. Our International Criminal Court Moot Court team has won best speaker awards, best brief awards, and in 2021 and 2023 made it to the Americas' final round, earning a berth in the international rounds in The Hague. And our Vis International Commercial Arbitration Moot Team has won the honorary mention award given to the top 20 oralists in Vienna four of the last seven years.
