
facilitate translation of dramatic writing. She was a contributing writer to the Cengage Learning first-year course in Italian, PIAZZA, 2015.

Lago Maggiore

Beloved by Lombardy's nobility, Lake Maggiore is Italy's second-largest lake and a natural boundary between the regions of Lombardy and Piedmont. A close rival to Lake Como as the most spectacular in the Lake District, Lake Maggiore's mild climate allows gardens to grow rare and exotic plants beneath the high Alps, particularly on the remarkable Borromean Islands. Enjoy a private boat cruise amidst the charming islands that inspired Gustave Flaubert, Richard Wagner and Johann Wolfgang von Goethe.

Borromean Islands

Cruise among Lake Maggiore's enticing islands, graced with elegant villas and striking natural beauty. Isola Bella, Isola di San Giovanni, Isola Madre and Isola dei Pescatori are collectively known as the Borromean Islands, named after the powerful Borromeos, a dynasty of counts, cardinals and warriors. During the 16th century, swathes of what is now North Central Italy were known as the Borromeo State, and the family wielded absolute political and military power.

Cruise past Isola Madre, the largest of the Borromean Islands, home to a diverse array of plants from every contintent.

Como

Founded by the Romans in 196 B.C., Como has been internationally known for its silk-weaving industry since silkworms were first imported here in the 14th century. At one time, Como was the largest European silk producer—dyeing, weaving and designing fabrics to be shipped to the fashion houses of Milan, Paris and London. Enjoy ideally located accommodations in the PALACE HOTEL on the shores of Lake Como and in the centro storico (old town) of this timeless Italian città. Stroll beside medieval towers and defensive walls, Renaissance palaces and churches, neoclassical 19th-century villas and small family-owned *negozi* (shops) leading to the Piazza Cavour and the tranquil lakeside promenade. See the magnificent Duomo di Como, which took nearly 400 years to complete, and is considered the most beautiful cathedral in Lombardy, reflecting a seamless blend of Gothic and Renaissance styles. Visit the 12th-century Romanesque Basilica di San Fedele, with stunning frescoed naves and apses and an exquisitely sculptured choir, carved by Comacini masters. Peruse the fresh fruit and vegetables in the tri-weekly outdoor market, a tradition for centuries.

CULTURAL ENRICHMENTS: A local scholar of Como from the Roman era to the present, and resident art historian Giuseppina Lucini will present a private expert lecture.



Experience the beauty of Bellagio, the "Pearl of Lake Como," beloved by many for its colorful houses, exquisite gardens and lovely villas set against a scenic Alpine backdrop.

CULTURAL ENRICHMENT: Visit the crown jewel of the Borromean archipelago, Isola Bella, entirely occupied by the 17th-century Palazzo Borromeo. Walk through its splendid Italianate gardens, a Baroque botanical masterpiece ablaze with roses, gardenias, azaleas and rhododendrons, described by Edith Wharton as a work of "Rennaissance poetry." Commissioned by Count Carlo Borromeo III in 1632, this secluded Baroque retreat is dedicated to his wife, Isabella, and its extravagant halls and opulent salons are filled with priceless masterpieces by Old Masters such as Peter Paul Rubens, Titian and Anthony Van Dyck. See the Sala di Napoleone, where Napoleon and Josephine slept in 1797, and the island's unforgettable grotto, decorated entirely with marble- and lava-studded mosaics of marine life.

Stresa

An 18th- and 19th-century "Grand Tour" of Europe was considered incomplete without visiting 10th-century Stresa to experience its spectacular mountain views, tropical gardens and the sparkling waters of Lake Maggiore. The quintessential *dolce vita* town, Stresa's inviting piazzas, cobblestone streets and lakeside promenade are dotted with *belle époque* mansions. A young Hemingway, recuperating in Stresa during World War I, was inspired to make it the setting for Frederic Henry and Catherine Barkley's famed reunion in *A Farewell to Arms*. **CULTURAL ENRICHMENT:** By special arrangement, visit the UNESCO World Heritage site of Santa Maria delle Grazie to experience the enduring genius of da Vinci's masterpiece, *The Last Supper*.

Lago di Como

Composer Franz Liszt romanticized, "When you write the story of two happy lovers, place them on the shores of Lake Como."

Cruise by private boat across the sparkling waters of Italy's deepest—and perhaps most spectacular—lake while learning more about its fascinating history and allure. Survey the quaint coastal village of Bellagio, a favorite retreat since the time of the Caesars, and the grand Renaissance villas built on the slopes of snowcapped mountains.

Villa del Balbianello

Across Lake Como from Bellagio is the magnificent Villa del Balbianello and its unique terraced gardens. Built in 1787 by Cardinal Angelo Maria Durini, this consummate Italian lake villa was renovated in the early 20th century by an American veteran of World War I. The villa was then purchased by Italy's first explorer to summit Mt. Everest, Guido Monzino, who bequeathed it to the Italian National Trust. A paragon of authentic Italian luxury, the villa is a repository of 18th-century French and English furniture and an exquisite collection of Monzino's Chinese, pre-Columbian and African art.

Milan

The recognized capital of the design and fashion worlds, Milan's cultural heritage blends

ornate palaces, Gothic churches and venerable museums with vibrant contemporary life, a wealth of modern art, an abundance of haute cuisine and outstanding operatic traditions. Visit Milan's exquisite late-Gothic Duomo, which dates to 1386, and the world-famous Teatro alla Scala opera house, a neoclassical jewel of sumptuous gilt boxes and glittering chandeliers, founded in 1778 by Empress Maria Theresa of Austria. Admire the 14th-century Piazza del Duomo which marks Milan's geographic, social and cultural heart.



The Palace Hotel

The ideally located, classic *belle époque* PALACE HOTEL is a delightful establishment with an ideal setting on the *lungolago* (lakefront promenade) overlooking Lake Como, just steps away from Como's beautiful marble Duomo and the medieval, pedestrian-only town center. Venetian stucco artistry, Italian marble and antique furniture provide subtle touches of 19th-century elegance throughout the hotel.

Its expertly landscaped gardens are the



perfect setting to admire enchanting views across Lake Como. The Garden Bar Ceccato, with its terrace overlooking the lake, is an excellent place to enjoy the hotel's renowned homemade ice cream or a cappuccino.

Each of the hotel's 94 recently renovated guest rooms is tastefully appointed with a private bathroom, air conditioning, satellite television, minibar and hair dryer. Meals feature fresh seasonal Italian ingredients, local specialties and international cuisine. Regional wine selections accompany dinner. The hotel staff provides exceptional service.

Bellagio

Perched on a promontory punctuated by stands of cypress trees, Bellagio is one of the Italian Lake District's most internationally well-known communes. In the 18th and 19th centuries, Milanese nobility flocked here to build elaborate villas and cultivate subtropical gardens. Cobblestone alleyways draped with bougainvillea wind above an idyllic waterfront promenade that affords spectacular Alpine vistas.

Lago d'Orta

Serene Lake Orta, nestled in the captivating Piedmont region of northwestern Italy, is the Lake District's best-kept secret. An ethereal mist rises above Lake Orta's forested shores which are imbued with a permeating stillness. Enjoy a walking tour of Orta San Giulio's medieval village center, a cinematic tableau of gracefully aging ocher-hued houses woven with arabesques of decorative wrought iron and flamboyant Baroque palazzos built by Italian nobility. Enjoy time at leisure in this beguiling village. **CULTURAL ENRICHMENT:** Atop the summit of Sacro Monte di Orta-one of nine sacred mountains in northern Italy and a UNESCO World Heritage site—amidst a picturesque landscape of forested hills, visit several small chapels dedicated to St. Francis of Assisi, decorated with elaborate frescoes built between the 16th and 18th centuries.

Isola San Giulio

Cruise across cobalt-blue Lake Orta in a private boat to diminutive and rarely visited Isola San Giulio, taking in stunning views of picture-perfect Italian villas and gardens along the way. Robert Browning, Honoré de Balzac and Byron all wrote of this intimate island's sublime beauty. Visit the 12th-century Romanesque-style Basilica di San Giulio, whose opulent interior is adorned with richly detailed frescoes painted upon the nave, chapel, vaults and aisles and, stroll the monastery's lush grounds.



Tesori di Verona e Venezia Post-Program Option*

Few cities have the power to enchant quite like Verona and Venice, UNESCO World Heritage sites. Verona is renowned for its well-preserved Romanesque and Gothic cathedrals, delightful piazzas and magnificent Roman monuments immortalized in William Shakespeare's timeless romance, *Romeo and Juliet*. See star-crossed Juliet's famous balcony, the crenellated 14th-century Castelvecchio and the spectacular 2000-year-old Roman Arena.

Discover the glories of centuries woven through a romantic tapestry of shimmering waterways crisscrossed by stone bridges that lead to Venice's extraordinary confection of architectural treasures, including the Gothic-style Doge's Palace. Cross the lagoon to the charming archipelago's island of Burano, known for its skilled fishermen and colorful houses. Enjoy three nights in the HOTEL BONVECCHIATI, an 18th-century

palazzo ideally located just a short walk from Venice's famous Piazza San Marco.
