



These local and imported religions from the east had secret rituals that promised direct connection/revelation to divine.



Marcion (85-160 ce)

Declared that the Jewish God was a malevolent deity, creator of the <u>physical</u> world.

Jesus was a messenger from the good <u>spiritual</u> Deity, sent to have us reborn in the spiritual realm of the True God and so to save our souls.

Therefore rejected the Jewish scriptures as the product of a lesser (evil) deity



St. Ignatius of Antioch (98-117 A.D.)

- For if we are still practicing Judaism, we admit that we have not received God's favor...it is wrong to talk about Jesus Christ and live like Jews. For Christianity did not believe in Judaism, but Judaism in hristianity. (*Letter to the Magnesians*)

St. Justin Martyr — Dialogue with Trypho (138–161 CE.)

- We too, would observe your circumcision of the flesh, your Sabbath days, and in a word, all you festivals, if we were not aware of the reason why they were imposed upon you, namely, because of your sins and the hardness of heart. The custom of circumcising the flesh, handed down from Abraham, was given to you as a distinguishing mark, to set you off from other nations and from us Christians.
- The purpose of this was that you and only you might suffer the afflictions that are now justly yours; that only your land be desolated, and your cities ruined by fire, that the fruits of your land be eaten by strangers before your very eyes; that not one of you be permitted to enter your city of Jerusalem. Your circumcision of the flesh is the only mark by which you can certainly be distinguished from other men.




John Chrysostom (349-407), Against the Jews: Homily I

- one. This is why I hasten to uproot and tear out this deadly opinion. I said that the synagogue is no better than a theater and I bring forward a prophet as my witness. Surely the Jews are not more deserving of belief than their prophets. "You had a harlot's brow; you became shameless before all". Where a harlot has set herself up, that place is a brothel. But the synagogue is not only a brothel and a theater; it also is a den of den of a hyena". He does not simply say "of wild beast", but "of a filthy wild beast", and again: "I have abandoned my house, I have cast off my inheritance". But when God forsakes a people, what hope of salvation is left? 
The Battles of the Early Muslims



- **Battle of Badr** first serious military confrontation of the Muslims (muhajjirun and ansar). It grew out of a Muslim attempt to ambush a Quraishi caravan. Although the caravan escaped harm, the Quraishi merchants sent out an army to defeat Muhammad and his force. The failure of the Meccans to defeat the Muslims enhanced Muhammad's leadership
- **Battle of Uhud** --The Quraish of Mecca assembled an army of 3,000 and marched to Medina to avenge their defeat at Badr. In the early stage the battle went in favor of the Muslims, but eventually the Quraish came to have the upper hand. It was at this stage that Ali took command and prevented the Quraish from taking advantage of their victory. The battle concluded as a draw.

Judaism Battle of the Trench and the Break with

- Sparked by an alliance between the Meccans and a Jewish tribe in Medina (the Banu Qurayza).
- The Muslims built a trench to blunt the attack. The attackers could only pass the trench at one point, where they ended up in limited man-to-man fights.
- After about 2 weeks the moral of the attacking forces was virtually gone, and then a violent wind with torrents of rain lasting for 3 days destroyed what was left. T
- The siege was lifted, the attackers returned home. Muhammad then turned on the Banu Qurayza and had all members of the tribe executed.



Four Righteous Imams (Rashidun)

- Abu Bakr (632-634)— one of oldest converts. Selected as successor (*Caliph*) by veteran Muslims.
- Umar (634-644)
 – nominated by Abu Bakr. Assassinated by a Persian soldier.
- Uthman (644-656) elected by council named by Umar. Compiled the Quran. Killed during a rebellion.
- Ali (656-661) son-in-law and cousin of Muhhamad, proclaimed leader by the people

Quran Chapter 3

- 116. As for those who disbelieve, neither their possessions nor their children will avail them anything against God. These are the inhabitants of the Fire, abiding therein forever.


Quran III

- [4: 153] The People of the Book ask thee to bring down to them a Book from heaven; but they demanded from Moses an even greater thing, for they said, "Show us Allah outright". shall not speak as they do, nor shall we adopt their kunyas. We shall not seek to resemble the Muslims by imitating any of their garments, the qalansuwa, the turban, footwear, or the parting of the hair. We

We shall not mount on saddles, nor shall we gird swords nor bear any kind of arms nor carry them on our- persons

We shall not engrave Arabic inscriptions on our seals

We shall not sell fermented drinks.

We shall clip the fronts of our heads

We shall always dress in the same way wherever we may be, and we shall bind the zunar round our waists

We shall not display our crosses or our books in the roads or markets of the Muslims. We shall use only clappers in our churches very softly. We shall not raise our voices when following our dead. We shall not show lights on any of the roads of the Muslims or in their markets. We shall not bury our dead near the Muslims.

We shall not take slaves who have been allotted to Muslims.

We shall not build houses overtopping the houses of the Muslims.


The extent of the Abbasid Empire

"People of the Book"

- In Quran and earliest Islam, the phrase referred to Jews, Christians and Sabians, that is other already existing monotheistic groups. It was understood that they already lived under a moral and religious code revealed by God.
- As the Muslim empire expanded, it was sometimes applied to other religious groups, even polytheistic Hindus.
- These religious groups had an intermediary status – less then full Muslims but above pagans and unbelievers.
