Last year's kickoff lecture was delivered by Sam Freedman, who fit the bill. Freedman — an award-winning author, journalist and Columbia University professor — is well known in Cleveland for his book *Jew vs. Jew*, which features a chapter on Beachwood's historic debate around synagogue construction and zoning. With the perspective of a journalist, as well as someone who is deeply engaged in the Jewish world, Freedman delivered an incisive critique of the way religion is portrayed in American media.
