UPCOMING EVENT: TOUR OF THE COZAD-BATES HOUSE AND INTERPRETIVE CENTER

The Cozad-Bates house was originally built by Andrew Cozad for his son Justus. The oldest section dates from 1853 with sections added in the 1860s and 1872. It I the only pre-Civil War house remaining in University Circle. The Cozads and their neighbors the Fords were very active in the anti-slavery movement and in the Underground Railroad. The Gund Foundation West Wing deals with slavery in the years leading up to the Civil War both nationally and locally. The Cleveland Foundation East Wing focuses on local anti-slavery activists and those freedom-seekers who passed through. The Key Bank Community Room deals with the impacts of slavery today in an exhibition developed by the Case Western Reserve University Social Justice Institute. <u>Click here for details and registration</u>.

He sits on the AI committee at the Clinic and spoke about how AI affects what we feel is ethical and unethical in the medical setting.
