

In early 2020, the Ukrainian Bandurist Chorus of North America (UBC) approached the Ukrainian National Women's League of America (UNWLA) about collaborating to produce a concert series dedicated to Lesya Ukrainka. Originally planned for 2021, the pandemic paused the production but not the preparation. Dozens of virtual, then in-person, rehearsals later, we are excited to share this new program with you.

The program highlights Lesya Ukrainka's poetry, power, and place in Ukrainian culture and literature through song. While preparing the program, it was recognized that relatively little of her poetry had been set to music for male voices and was absent from the UBC repertoire. This provided an opportunity for several exciting new works: The "Seven Strings" suite composed by UBC Artistic Director and Conductor, Oleh Mahlay, and "Contra Spem Spero" by Concertmaster, Mykola Deychakiwsky. Throughout the program, in addition to visual graphics and narration, we include images of kobzari from the early 20th century and excerpts from rare wax cylinder recordings of Ukrainka's own voice.

The story of our ensemble originates in Kyiv, Ukraine, in 1918. For over 100 years, the UBC has been the guardian of the majestic 60-stringed musical instrument – the Bandura. In the seven decades since settling in the United States after World War II, we have continued to share the historic and modern story of Ukraine globally, whether it be through educational initiatives or performances. The bandura is an icon of Ukraine's national identity and voice. Today, we are projecting Lesya's voice to propel her incredible work.

Today's concert will also help Ukraine's needs at this time. A portion of the net proceeds will support humanitarian needs in Ukraine. Thank you for joining us!



Founded in Kyiv in 1918 by Vasyl Yemets as the "Kobzar Choir", its successor continued to perform until being disbanded by the Soviet government at the outbreak of World War II. In 1941, the ensemble was reconstituted in Ukraine's capital by many of its former members, and eventually emigrated to the United States in 1949 where is continues its mission: to share the bandura and the traditions of the kobzari with a global audience.

For more than a century, the UBC has preserved and promoted the art of bandura by amassing an extensive discography and by touring North America, Australia, Europe, and Ukraine having performed at such well-known concert venues as Carnegie Hall, the Kyiv Opera House, Kennedy Center, the Notre Dame Cathedral and Massey Hall.

As a tribute to its role in preserving and perpetuating the legacy of Ukrainian music, the UBC was selected by Ukraine's Council of Ministers as the recipient of the Taras Shevchenko Ukrainian State Prize, the highest award that can be bestowed for excellence in the contribution to the arts. The award was presented to the UBC by Leonid Kravchuk, then president of Ukraine, in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, during his first visit to the United States in May 1992.

The UBC continues to make history with ongoing international concerts, an education program for youth, new recordings, and new talent. Intense passion for music by its members is united behind the common goal to extend the tradition of its predecessors, kobzari, by producing memorable performances on the world stage.

Today, the UBC is led by Artistic Director and Conductor, Oleh Mahlay. He has been a musician with the ensemble since 1982 and became its artistic director and conductor in 1996. During his tenure (1996 through 2008, and from 2012 through the present), the UBC has achieved artistic acclaim as a result of nine released recordings, educational outreach programming, and hundreds of concerts throughout North America and Europe (including two historic tours of Ukraine). In September of 2021, Maestro Mahlay received the prestigious Honored Artist of the Ukrainian Arts (заслужений діяч мистецтв України) which was presented to him by President Volodymyr Zelenskyy at a ceremony in Washington, D.C.

Maestro Mahlay received a bachelor of arts in music history and literature from Case Western Reserve University in Cleveland, Ohio, and has a varied musical background as a conductor, pianist, violinist, lecturer and composer. He studied piano with Dr. George Cherry of the Baldwin Wallace College Conservatory of Music, and his violin teachers included Elmer Setzer of the Cleveland Orchestra and Jeannette Drinkold-Meyer, a student of renowned violinist Josef Gingold.
