

# REDI Pilot Funding Opportunity FAQs

#### Application ID

- Does the study team only need one ID for the study to be uploaded?
  - Yes, one SPARC ID.

#### **Budget**

- What expenses can be included in the budget?
  - Please see Annual Pilot guidelines

- Can you budget for less than the disclosed minimum (i.e., less than \$15K)?
  - Yes. If you are budgeting for significantly less than the disclosed minimum, please consider applying for a <u>Core Utilization Pilot</u> (up to \$10K). Please e-mail <u>CTSC-administrator@case.edu</u> with questions.

## Letters of Recommendation/Support

- Who can submit letters of recommendation/support? A PI or Co-I on the proposal/application cannot write a letter of recommendation/support for their own project. All letters must come from sources external to/outside of the project.
- Who should letters of support/recommendation be addressed to?
  - We do not have a prescribed way to address letters of support/recommendation.
    Something similar to "Dear CTSC RED Pilot Funding Opportunity Review Committee" is sufficient.

# PI or Study Team Member Transfer

- What happens to the study and funding if a PI or other study team member moves to another institution (e.g., VA, MetroHealth, UH, Cleveland Clinic)?
  - Recipients may not transfer these awards to another institution or to another individual. Reallocations in the approved budget require prior written approval before expenditure. Awardees are required to give **90 days notice** of any change in institution, and funds will be prorated when an applicant leaves the institution within any funding year.



# REDI Pilot Funding Opportunity FAQs, cont.

### Study Team

- How should students (undergraduate or graduate) who are supporting study research be designated within the proposal (e.g., mentee, trainee, etc.)?
  - There is no recommended verbiage for how students should be designated in the proposal.
- Can someone from outside the listed institutions on the funding opportunity (i.e., CWRU, UH, Cleveland Clinic, MetroHealth, VA) serve as a Co-I?
  - Yes. Investigators from outside institutions may be listed as Co-I on the proposal, however, ONLY SALARY AND FRINGE BENEFITS may be requested for the Co-I. NO INDIRECTS will be paid to the outside institution.

#### Formatting

- Should applicants draft requested documents with double- or single-spaces?
  - Please follow standard NIH style formatting (i.e., 0.5" margins, single spaced, 11 pt. font).

#### References

- May applicants include more than 10 references total?
  - No, please include only 10 references.
- Can applicants include a supplemental list of references?
  - No, please include only 10 references.
