

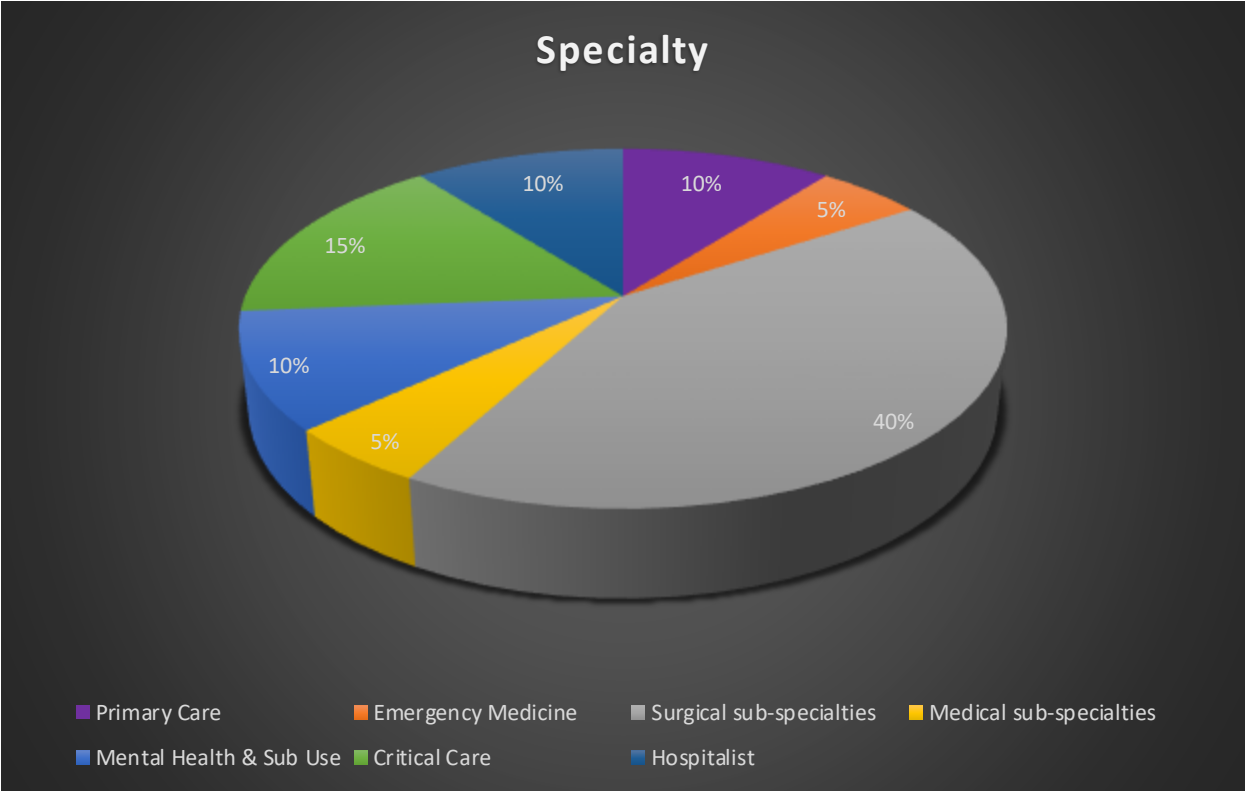
CWRU PA Graduate Employment

Graduates

The graduates of the Case Western Reserve University Physician Assistant Program are surveyed upon graduation and every year post-graduation. The program tracks employment activities used to evaluate the program's goals.

Survey results from the inaugural Class of 2018 show that our graduates are working in a variety of specialties in medicine and surgery [figure 1]. 10% of the graduating Class of 2018 is working in primary care (i.e., family medicine, pediatrics) and 5% are employed in an emergency department.

Breaking the specialties down further by medical and surgical sub-specialties we see an equal distribution of our graduates practicing in medical sub-specialties (40%) and surgical sub-specialties (40%) [figures 2A and 2B].

Figure 2A: Sub-Specialty Practice

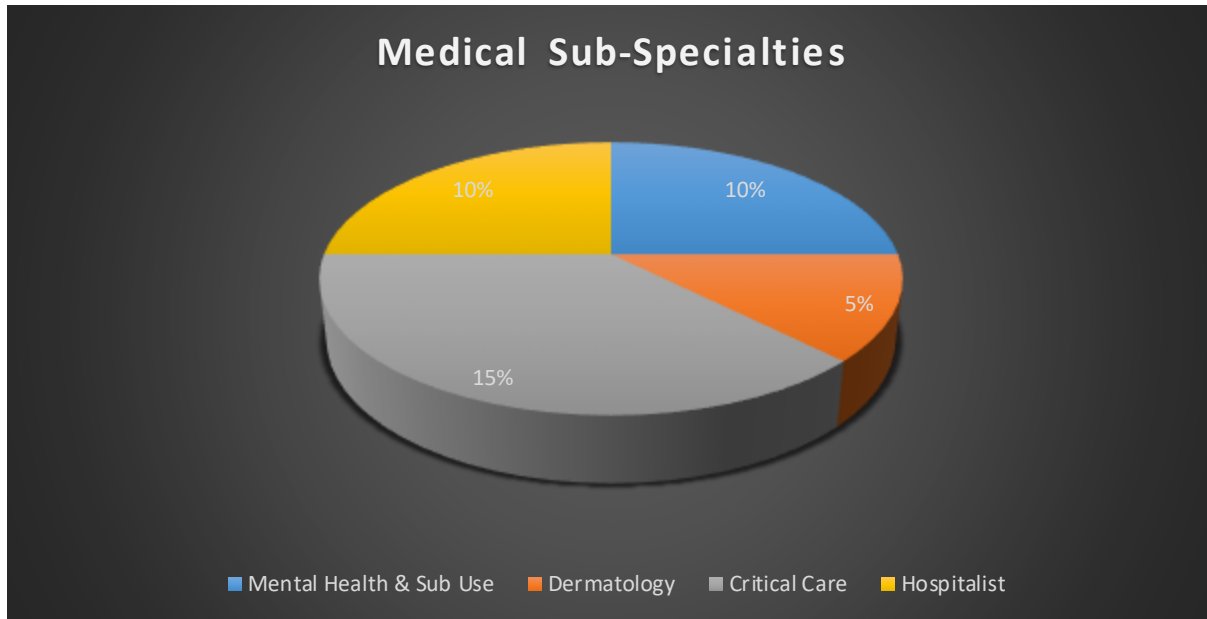
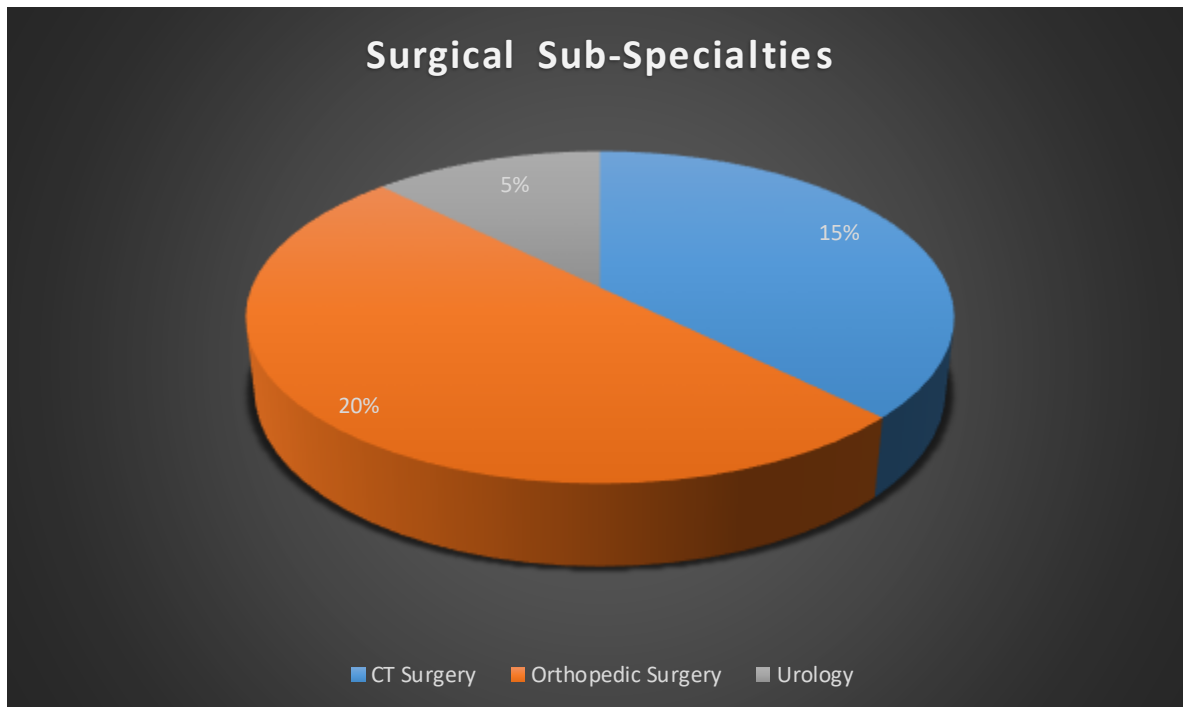
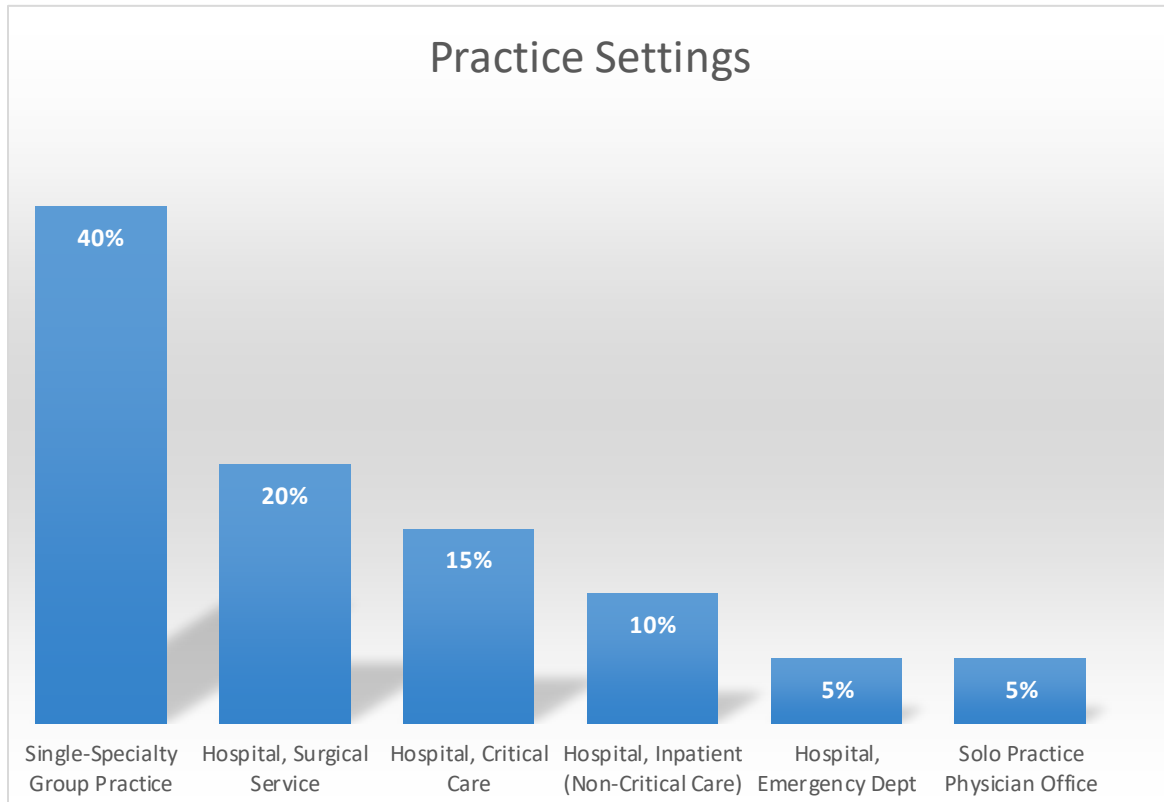


Figure 2B: Surgical Sub-Specialty
