This Day in PA History

Joyce Nichols, PA-C is not a name that is often remembered, but her legacy has helped to shape today's PA profession. She was known as not only the first woman to practice as a PA, but was also a Black American licensed practical nurse who changed the way people looked at the "average PA." Before Nichols, typical PA students were white male corpsmen. She quickly earned the respect of her classmates and program faculty as she excelled through the curriculum, despite all the obstacles- one of which was a house fire that resulted in the loss of all of her belongings. Nichols and her supportive classmates worked tirelessly to help create a path for more women and minorities to enter the medical field and it is her advocacy for diversity that continues to serve as a beacon of inspiration.-Hinali Patel, PA-S2, Hudson Society Historian
