

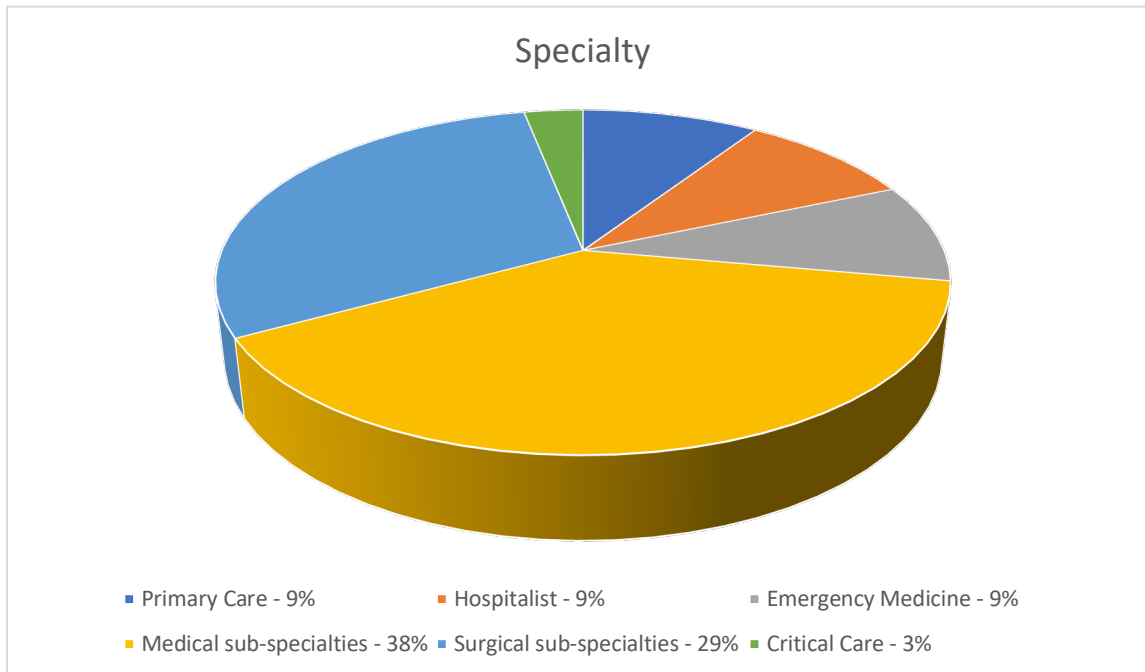
CWRU PA Graduate Employment

Graduates

The graduates of the Case Western Reserve University PA Program are surveyed upon graduation and every year post-graduation. The program tracks employment activities used to evaluate the program's goals.

Survey results from the Class of 2020 show that our graduates continue to work in a variety of medical and surgical disciplines [figure 1]. Sixty-seven percent of the graduating Class of 2020 are working in medical and surgical sub-specialties while thirty percent of graduates are working in primary care (i.e., family medicine, adult medicine, pediatrics), hospital medicine (including critical care) and emergency medicine.

Breaking the specialties down further by medical and surgical, we see our graduates working in a wide variety of medical (38%) and surgical sub-specialties (29%) [figures 2A and 2B].

Figure 2A: Medical Sub-Specialty Practice

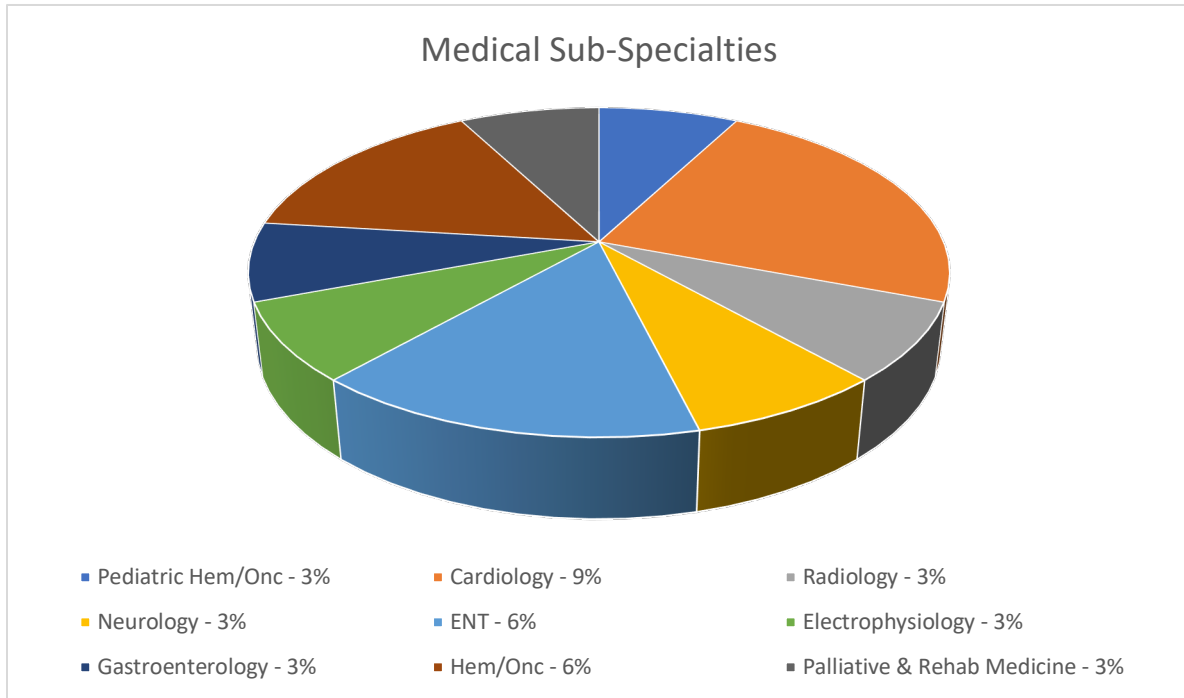
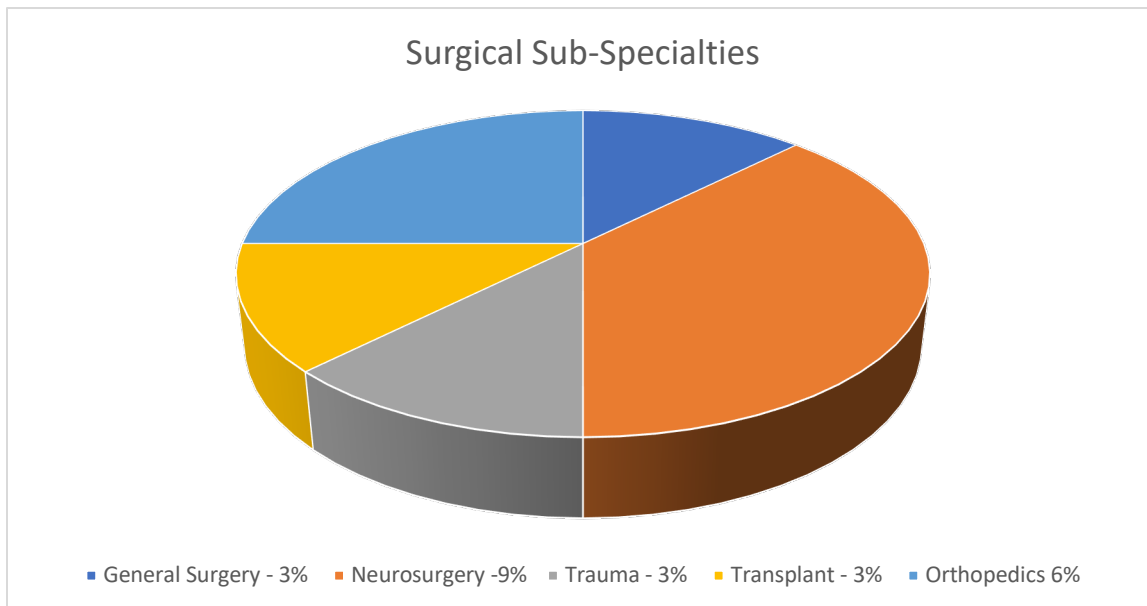
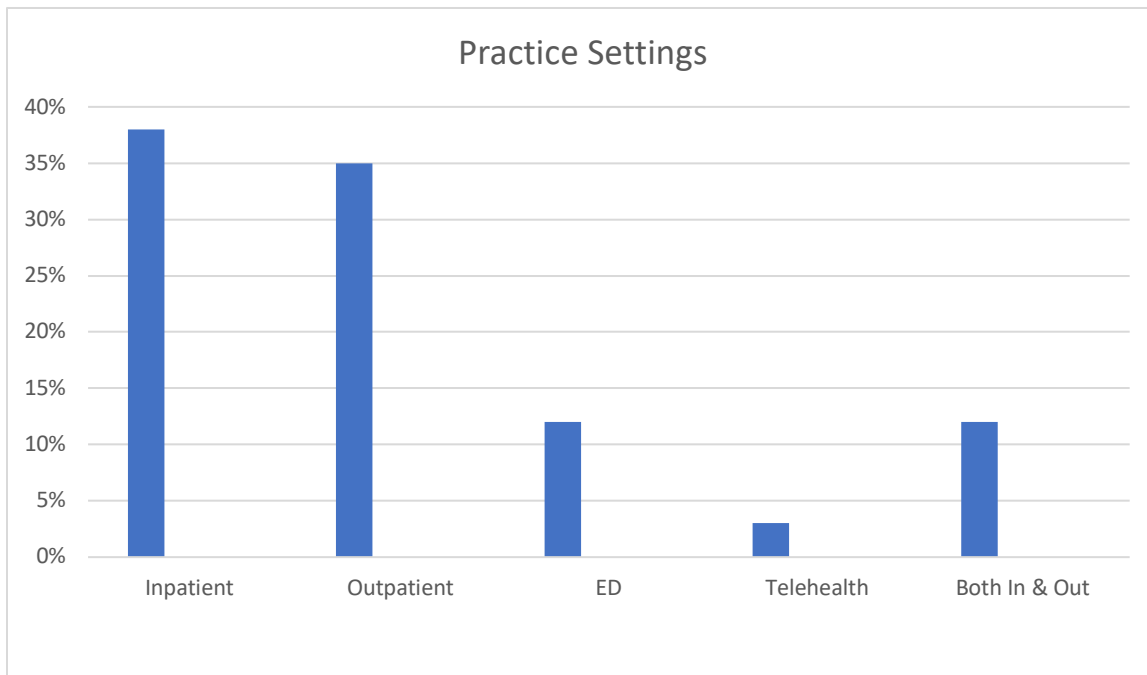


Figure 2B: Surgical Sub-Specialty Practice
