#### Online application through SOPHAS

- Personal statement and reflective essay
- Bachelor's degree from an accredited institution (either already complete, or will be complete before you enroll)
- Unofficial transcripts
- Current resume/CV
- Three letters of recommendation
- Test scores optional
- International applicants: Results of TOEFL, IELTS or PTE
- International applicants: WES transcript evaluation
