In CWRU's two-year program, you'll put coursework into practice, exploring gene expression and development as well as the ethical, legal and social issues that arise in clinical genetics.

#### In year one, you will:

- Develop an understanding of clinical and molecular genetics,
- · Learn to work in an interprofessional setting, and
- · Complete community-based projects.

#### In year two, you will gain experience through:

- Three eight-week fieldwork rotations,
- Two elective four-week rotations
- · A two-week lab rotation, and
- A six-week summer immersive fieldwork rotation.
