Diversified Learning

You'll begin the program focusing on the core curriculum and foundational elements in stem-cell biology, bio-material engineering, medical product development, federal regulations, bioethics, and bringing discoveries to market. Beyond these core courses, you'll have the flexibility in your classes to individualize your studies and then hone your focus in an industry internship or hands-on laboratory research.

By the end of the program, you will be trained in academic, commercial, and clinical settings to support cellular manufacturing, biotechnology innovation, legal compliance, financial analysis, venture capital, and business development activities. Your education will take advantage of our strengths across the disciplines of regenerative medicine as a whole to prepare you for the future of a dynamic and developing career field.

A Curriculum Tailored to You

Our 30-credit hour master's program is tailored to your academic goals, allowing you to build skills in medical research and entrepreneurial business while learning about stem cell therapy and the medicine of longevity.

You'll have the option for full-time study spread across 15-months or two years, or study part-time at your own pace.

RGME is part of the CWRU Fusion program, offering courses through the School of Law, School of Engineering, and Weatherhead School of Management. By taking specific electives, students have the opportunity to complete a professional certificate in addition to their MS degree.
