

# CONSIDER RUNNING FOR GSNA EXECUTIVE BOARD FOR THE NEXT ACADEMIC YEAR

**You are a member of the GSNA if you are a MN, MSN, or DNP student.**

- If you plan to be enrolled in class for Fall AND Spring, you are eligible to run for the GSNA BOARD
  - **You can also get involved in a variety of ways by contacting the VP for your class!**
- The GSNA Board guides the GSNA through events and opportunities including:
  - Social events like Homecoming at the Jolly Scholar, attendance at the annual Weatherhead Halloween Ball, breakfast at the FPB intensives, Alumni-sponsored Job Search, and networking opportunities
  - Professional Growth Grant administration--disseminating and evaluating applications and determining awards
  - Charitable and Community events like food drives, book drives for a new school of nursing in Tanzania, increasing awareness for proper disposal of controlled drugs, and support for the Student-Run Free Clinic
  - Communicating opportunities for students to serve FPB on the Evaluation Committee and Appeals Committee
- There are 5 elected & many appointed members on GSNA Executive Board.
  - Elected Positions are:
    - **President** (generally someone who has served for a year on the Board). The President schedules and develops the agenda for Board meetings.
    - **3 Vice Presidents** (one from each of the constituent programs). The VPs represent students in the MN, MSN and DNP programs.
    - **Treasurer**. The treasurer assists the FPB financial officer with GSNA revenue and expense distribution and reports related to GSNA funds.
  - Appointed positions can include:
    - **Public relations and Communication**
    - **Secretary**
    - **Ambassadors** to the University-wide Graduate Professional Council.

## HOW TO APPLY?

- Write a letter of intent (*be sure to name the office or appointed position that interests you!*) and update your resume.

Applications for Board positions are generally due early March, with the Election results announced in April, and a transitional Board meeting in May. You must be able to commit to monthly onsite or “virtual” meetings and generate ongoing communication with your Board and class members, and be willing to communicate, create and collaborate!
