



Diversity-gender—11.6%




Diversity-ethnicity and race 26.7%

Trends

- 2014: 859 students total
 - More BSN, DNP and PhD students
 - More MN students with a larger number of men
 - MSN enrollment remains a focus
 - Focused recruitment efforts continue in MN, MSN and PhD in conjunction with Student Services
- 2013: 822
- 2012: 821



Highlights

- 26.7% minority (6.5% unreported; last year much higher unreported)
 - **–** 2013: 29.5%; 2012: 25.4%; 2011: 23%
 - National average is 26.5% across all types of schools
 - National figures: BSN 26.9%, MSN 26.6%, DNP 22.0%, PhD 24.7%,
 - Our figures: BSN 39%, MN 28%, MSN 23%, DNP 22%; PhD 52.3%
- 11.6% male
 - **–** 2013: 10.7%; 2012: 11.8%
 - National average is 11.4% for BSN programs only; 9.9% for MSN program
 - Our figures: BSN 8%; MSN 19%





Campaign Attainment Toward Goal School of Nursing June 2014 (\$25.5 Million)








as of 6/30/14










Attainment by Purpose


