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#### Nursing's Joyce Fitzpatrick Receives Living Legend honor



Of the 3.5 million nurses in the United States, only 2,400 hold the distinction of membership in the American Academy of Nursing (AAN). More selective still is the academy's designation of Living Legend—only a handful are chosen each year. Now, count Joyce Fitzpatrick among their ranks. An internationally renowned researcher, author, educator,

leadership coach and icon in her field, Fitzpatrick, the Elizabeth Brooks Ford Professor of Nursing at the Frances Payne Bolton School of Nursing, accepted the Living Legend award on Oct. 20, 2016 at AAN's annual conference in Washington, D.C. "Dr. Fitzpatrick has a vision of what nursing ought to be, is always future-oriented as to what we can become together," said May Wykle, emerita professor of nursing and former dean of the nursing school, who nominated Fitzpatrick for the award (which she received in 2011).
