The Bachelor of Science of Nursing, the Master of Nursing/Graduate Entry Nursing, and Master of Science of Nursing programs are accredited through June 2021, while the Doctor of Nursing Practice and Post-Master's certificate programs are accredited for 10 years through 2026. The school's PhD program is accredited through the University's School of Graduate Studies.
