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It is recommended that full time students take 9 credits each of the Fall and Spring semester during the first two years in order to complete coursework. Accelerating coursework (e.g., by taking courses during the summer) will have implications for future course planning, including proposal development. It may not be to one's advantage. Part time students should take no fewer than 6 credits each semester.

Important Points:

- 1) Enrollment in NURS 671 (proposal development) requires a clear research statement and identification of and working with one's candidacy committee (i.e., chair/advisor, and two faculty members from the SON, at least one of which must be a nurse. The course culminates with the candidacy examination).
- 2) Enrollment in dissertation credits (NURS 701) requires successful completion of the candidacy examination (form to be filed) or petition for predoctoral standing (form to be filed).
