Ashley Shew is an associate professor of science, technology, and society at Virginia Tech and cofounder of the Disability Community Technology (DisCoTec) Center. Her current research sits at the intersection of technology studies, biotech ethics, and disability studies. Her books include *Against Technoableism:* Rethinking Who Needs Improvement, Animal Constructions and Technological Knowledge and Spaces for the Future (coedited).
