

CWRU Parking is set to implement license plate recognition (LPR) enforcement technology on campus in the upcoming weeks. This innovative LPR system will facilitate more effective and efficient enforcement across campus, ensuring that parking remains fair and equitable for all.

Along with this technology, a new regulation regarding the display of license plates while parked on campus will be introduced. The specifics of this rule are outlined below:

1. Vehicles must be parked in a manner that allows a valid, state-issued license plate to be visible from the immediate drive lane.
2. A front license plate is required for back-in, pull-through, or any other parking styles where the vehicle's front faces the drive lane.
3. No parking stall may separate the license plate from the drive lane, even if the stall is unoccupied.
4. The license plate visible to the adjacent drive lane must remain unobstructed.
5. License plate facsimiles or placements, when avoidable, cannot be such that they are not able to be read by license plate recognition technology.
 - a. [Note: CWRU acknowledges that Ohio law does not require a front license plate. This rule aims to enhance the efficient enforcement of our parking facilities.]

ACTION REQUIRED: Permit holders should [log in to their account](#) and verify that all vehicles they may bring to campus are connected to their parking permit. If a license plate is not linked to an active parking permit, the LPR technology will identify the vehicle as being in violation. Below are instructions on how to add a vehicle to your parking permit:

1. [Log in to your account - scroll down and choose 'CWRU Single Sign On'](#)
2. Under Permits Click 'View Your Permits'. Click on Permit Number Underlined.
3. Check associated vehicles. Click 'Add Vehicles to Permit' then scroll down and click 'Add a New Vehicle' and enter vehicle information. If you have 3 vehicles already in the system, you will not be able to add or delete. Email parking@case.edu the vehicles to delete and your new vehicle make, model, license plate, state, year, color.
