Research Committee (Rep: Sagar Regmi)

- Faculty Senate Meeting was held on Jan 13th.
- Senior Vice President for Research Michael Oakes gave a presentation where he highlighted about the imbalance of focus areas (85% research in medicine), teamoriented research grant approach, discussed on core facilities (like optimization of research administration), focus on sustainable management, artificial intelligence, machine learning (AI-ML), therapeutics, eco-system, intercollabrative science board, grant funding for the department, as well as tech commercialization scholarship.
- Michael Oakes supports increasing funding for the postdocs
- Sagar highlighted the need for a postdoctoral fellowship (e.g. Presidential postdoctoral research fellowship in CWRU) that can support postdocs with excellent credentials
- Requested support for the grant writing workshop like finding a speaker, Joan Schenkel (jms114@case.edu) is happy to assist PDA for this.
- Highlighted the importance of organizing an NSF career preparation workshop for postdocs.

Committee on Minority Affairs (Rep: Haley Nguyen)

- Committee will meet Women's Affairs committee and Provost to discuss about the status of a proposed "Child Care Center"
- Committee will encourage the CWRU management to issue a statement condemning "violence against Asian community"
- Committee proposed a new position of Vice-Chair who will be a "person of color" and will seek nomination for the same
- Committee considers it is compulsory to include a "Statement on Diversity, Equity and Inclusion" while applying for a faculty position to the Executive committee
