Postdoc Office

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What is a postdoc?

An individual holding a doctoral degree, engaged in a temporary period of mentored research and/or scholarly training for the purpose of acquiring professional skills needed to pursue a career path of their choosing.

<u>Scholars</u> are funded by CWRU or grants received by the PI. <u>Fellows</u> are funded by grants or fellowships they obtain on their own or are classified as external training grants.

Visas

Most international postdocs are on J1 visas, but we also have some on H1Bs and F1 OPTs. J1 visas are typically issued for 5 years and H1B visas for 3 years. The VISA Office processes all visas on campus.

Orientation and Onboarding

Pls, Department Administrators, and the Postdoc Office are here to help make the hiring transition smooth. The <u>Postdoc Association members</u> are also available to answer questions or give advice.



In-person, half day Orientation held on the 1st Thursday of every month. Network with other postdocs, learn the policies and resources available, and hear from campus partners.



1 hour Zoom Benefits Reviews conducted every Wednesday. Overview of the postdoc website, learn the costs of coverage, benefits package components, how to find care, and how to enroll.

IDP / Annual Review / Renewal

Postdoc appointments are only administered for one year at a time. This is to ensure they receive their annual salary increase and that their annual review is completed.

- In order to get renewed, postdocs must complete the <u>Annual Review Form</u> with their PI. The Annual Review allows the postdoc to highlight what they've accomplished, as well as facilitate a conversation between the postdoc and PI about growth and development.
- Postdocs are encouraged to work with their PIs during the first 3 months of their training to develop an <u>Individual Development Plan (IDP)</u>. This helps identify strengths, areas for improvement, goals, and specific strategies to achieve those goals.

Salary / Stipend

- Postdocs are salary, exempt, special-class employees.
- Paid once monthly on the last working day of the month via direct deposit.



CWRU uses the NIH NRSA scale for the minimum salary guidelines and annual increases

Vision: EyeMed

\$10 annual exam, annual allowance towards glasses OR contacts



Dental: MetLife

\$1,250 annual allowance, 1 x free oral exam and x-rays



Life Insurance: The Standard

\$20k Basic Life Insurance, up to \$20k Accidental Death and Dismemberment, Medical Evacuation / Repatriation of Remains for visa holders



Employee Assistance Program: Impact Solutions

24/7 assistance - mental health counseling, financial/legal consultation, life coaching, referrals, medical advocacy (*free, confidential, and available to the postdoc, dependents, parents, and in-laws)



Medical: Aetna

Choice between the HNO or POS plans \$500 annual deductible

1 free Wellness Visit and Women's Wellness visit per year No requirement to get a referral from the primary care physician to see a specialist 90 day supply of prescriptions by mail option



- Postdocs MUST sign up for benefits within 31 days of their start date
- Benefits start as of day 1 of employment. At the end of the appointment, benefits are good through the end of the month, COBRA available.

Time Off

Vacation

- 16 days annually
- Accrued at 1.33 days/month
- Max of 16 days can be carried over to next fiscal year (July 1 June 30)
- Remaining vacation leave is paid out when postdoc leaves CWRU (Scholars only, not Fellows)

<u>Sick</u>

- 10 sick days given on each anniversary
- Carried over year to year

Floating Holiday

- 1 floating holiday per year
- Does not carry over year to year

Holidays

- New Year's Eve, New Year's Day, MLK Day, Memorial Day, Juneteenth, 4th of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving (2), Christmas (2)

Appreciative Time Off

- 'Take Two' in June and July.
- The University closes the week between Christmas and New Year's.
- If a holiday falls on a Tuesday or Thursday, the university closes that Monday or Friday.



<u>Postgrad Audit Program</u> - auditors pay only 10% of tuition




8 weeks <u>paid parental leave</u>, and <u>childcare</u> <u>discounts and support during travel</u>
