Purpose

The 17 Global Goals were unanimously agreed upon by all United Nations member states in September 2015, and provide a roadmap for action; ending poverty, protecting the planet, and ensuring prosperity for all by 2030. Achieving the Global Goals by 2030 means that every person will have the chance to live a decent, dignified life on a healthy planet. This is the biggest, most ambitious plan ever attempted by humanity. This seminar presentation will introduce the Provost Scholars to the Global Goals and ask them to think critically about what actions they can take to help achieve them.
