Dr. Shemariah J. Arki is an educator, an activist and an organizer. She is an instructor in the Department of Pan African Studies at Kent State University and the founder of the Ellipsis Institute for Women of Color in the Academy at Case Western Reserve University. Dr. Arki received her BBA and MEd from the American Intercontinental University and her EdD from Northeastern University. As an auto/ethnographic researcher and creative non-fiction writer, her work centers on cultural epistemologies and the construction of a #BlackCommaFeminist pedagogy. Dr. Arki also serves as an editor for the forthcoming textbook, *Teaching Brilliant and Beautiful Black Girls*, curated to position classrooms as places of radical transformation and to amplify the voices of the Black girls who inhabit them. Dr. Arki also serves as the Founder and Lead Experience Curator for Sankofa Circle Studios, where she engages creative entrepreneurs by emphasizing one goal: lift as you climb.
