Interactive AED/Stop The Bleed map: The "AED/Stop The Bleed Map" button in the services tab will display an interactive map with pips representing

interactive map with pins representing campus location with AED and Stop the Bleed kits.

- iReports/Tips: You can send nonemergency messages (icy sidewalk, parking violator, maintenance issues) directly to campus police from anywhere you have service, on or off campus. You can even send them anonymously if you want. The message will go directly to campus police and be addressed.
- ** Never put yourself in harm's way to capture and send a tip. Use the emergency calling feature instead.
- How do I get it?: The CWRU Shield app is available for a free download on Android (PlayStore) or Apple (iTunes) smartphones. Anyone with a valid Case Western Reserve, Cleveland Institute of Art or Cleveland Institute of Music email address can download it free. Make sure to complete and save your profile information to activate the app.

In August 2014, the Case Western Reserve University Division of Public Safety launched the CWRU Shield smartphone safety app as part of our continuing efforts to make the campus experience as safe as possible. CWRU was the first university in the nation to use such a service utilizing indoor positioning technology (IPS), which can pinpoint your location inside a campus building during an emergency. Nearly 10,000 students and staff have since downloaded and actively use it's many different features.

The app's main features are:

- One touch emergency calling
- Setting "Friend Watch"

- Access to the SafeRide shuttle between the hours of **7** p.m. and **3** a.m.
- Access to the campus busing system
- Interactive AED/Stop The Bleed map
- Ability to send non-emergency tips to campus police

Emergency calling: Pressing the emergency call button while on or near campus will send an alert to campus police displaying your location on a map. Your phone will then prompt to call campus police. If the emergency call button is pressed when

outside of campus area (another citv or state), the app will recognize this and call the nearest 911 call center.

Friend Watch: With this feature, you type in your activity (jogging, walking home from the library) and select an end-time. Your selected emergency contacts will be sent a text message alerting them you initiated a "Friend Watch" and will be sent a link to a map showing your location. Once you arrive at your location or complete your activity, simply cancel the timer. Your selected emergency contact will be sent a text message showing you are safe. If your time expires before you cancel the timer, your emergency contact will be sent a text message alerting them you may need help along with a map of your last known location.

SafeRide: In addition to the campus bus system, CWRU Police offers a free shuttle service between the hours of 7 p.m. and 3 a.m., 7 days a week. To request a ride from your phone, simply press the "Get SafeRide" button in the app.

*** High call volume during peak hours or adverse weather conditions may affect response times. Campus bus systems may be a quicker option.

Bus system access: You can access the campus bus system in the "Shuttle Tracking" section of the app. Just press the "Shuttle Tracking" button and the current location of busses/routes and their arrival time to each stop location is displayed.

*Disclaimers: CWRU Shield cannot be accessed when you do not have mobile phone coverage. To allow authorities to find your location, "Location Services" must be enabled on your phone. For the app to track your approximate location inside select buildings, you must be connected to Wi-Fi. If you are not connected to Wi-Fi, CWRU Shield will determine your approximate location via your phone's GPS.
