

Summary

All of the programs mentioned here are only introductions to self-defense concepts. Members of the campus community interested in more in-depth training or classes in this area are encouraged to pursue further training both within and outside the university. No system can guarantee 100% success in all cases; self-defense training can only enhance the options for a person who is attacked. In many cases, if flight is possible, it remains the best option.

PERSONAL ALARMS—In the fall, the division gives away personal keychain alarms that give off a high-pitched noise when activated. They are designed to draw attention and possibly frighten off potential attackers. Alarms can be found at Police Headquarters, 1689 E.115th St.



The CWRU Division of Public Safety offers two types of programs for faculty, staff, and students interested in improving their selfdefense knowledge and basic skills.

THE RAPE AGGRESSION DEFENSE (RAD) PROGRAM

- The division has several instructors certified by Rape Aggression Defense Systems Inc. (RAD), a nationwide program teaching women's self defense. A RAD class is offered at least once each semester or by arrangement to those faculty, staff and students who identify as female.
- RAD is a series of four three-hour classes usually taught in the evening. The first three classes focus on teaching riskreduction strategies and some basic self-defense techniques. The fourth class, which is optional, consists of a simulation exercise during which students can practice their techniques against live aggressors in a controlled training environment.
- Members who complete the first three classes are considered RAD certified and have the ability to attend RAD classes throughout the United States for free in the future as part of the lifetime practice policy.

 RAD classes are free for the campus community, and dates are advertised in *The* Daily. Contact radprogram@case.edu for more information.

STREET SMARTS SEMINAR

Street Smarts is a one- to two-hour selfdefense seminar offered by CWRU PD that covers basic self-defense strategies and teaches a few basic self-defense moves. It is taught on request to small groups ranging from sororities and other student groups to individual staff or faculty departments.

These include the shuttle bus system, and the Safe Ride van that operates from 6 p.m. 3 a.m. nightly.
