

ACTIVE AGGRESSOR/ SHOOTER

An active shooter/aggressor incidents are unpredictable and can evolve quickly.

An active aggressor or shooter is a person who appears to be actively engaged in killing or attempting to kill people in a populated area—typically using firearms, but possibly using other weapons such as knives or vehicles.

IF YOU ARE INVOLVED IN AN ACTIVE AGGRESSOR/SHOOTER INCIDENT

Case Western Reserve follows the Run. Hide. Fight. active-aggressor protocol:

Run

- · Have an escape route and plan in mind.
- Leave your belongings behind.
- · Help others escape, if possible.
- Evacuate regardless of others.
- Warn/prevent individuals from entering the area.

Hide

- Be out of the active aggressor's view.
- · Provide protection if shots are fired.
- Don't restrict options for movement.
- Transition and run away if the situation allows.
- If the shooter is nearby:
 - Lock the door.
 - Hide behind large items.
 - Silence your phone.
 - Remain quiet.

Fight

- · Commit to your actions.
- Act as aggressively as possible.
- Throw objects and improvised items around you as weapons.
- · Work together to incapacitate the aggressor.

When law enforcement arrives:

- 1. Remain calm, and follow officers' instructions.
- 2. Immediately raise hands and spread fingers.
- 3. Keep hands visible at all times.
- 4. Avoid making quick movements toward officers, such as attempting to hold on to them for safety.
- 5. Avoid pointing, screaming and/or yelling.
- 6. Do not stop to ask officers for help or direction when evacuating—just proceed in the direction from which officers are entering the premises.
