## Committee Spotlight: Community Service



SAC Community Service Committee has been involved with the following Community Service Projects throughout the years:

- The initial proposal for time off to enable staff to provide community service on a regular basis. The first year of this endeavor began as "Case Cares" and allowed all interested staff members to donate a half day of service to specified projects. This event has grown over nine years to include staff, faculty, and students, and is now known as "Case for Community Day (CFCD)." The committee just finished its third year of collecting school supplies.
- The Annual Basket Raffle is in its 13th year. We have collected \$54,800 dollars, which has been donated throughout the community and the country.
- Community Volunteerism has included Ronald McDonald House, Holiday Caroling at Judson Manor, Cleveland Food Bank, Clothing Drive for Dress for Success, City Mission, MedWish, and Cultural Gardens. We are currently partnering with "Hands On," an organization that coordinates volunteer opportunities in the community.

We are fulfilling community service with activities designed to improve the quality of life off-campus for community members (residents, organizations, municipalities, etc.). We are very proud to help better our community through service and outreach to our neighbors. For many decades, Case Western Reserve University has played a pivotal role in improving the quality of life for others throughout Cleveland and the Northeast Ohio region. CWRU strives to be the most powerful learning environment in the world. We constantly challenge ourselves to create a culture of transformation so engaging that students, faculty, staff, alumni, trustees, and even visitors to the campus become passionate about moving beyond themselves to express creativity, pursue innovation and discovery, and serve humanity.

### **SAC Recap**
