### How To Get Involved

Adelbert Hall, Toepfer Room, from 10:00 - 11:30 am. The committees have varying schedules, but typically meet once a month for one hour. General council meetings are open to the campus community.

Employees who can't commit to serving as an elected representative may still participate in SAC. SAC encourages employees to voice their opinions, ideas and concerns, either directly at a Council meeting, or by contacting one of their representatives.
