

# Bachelor of Science in Nursing with Childhood Studies Minor

## Childhood Studies Minor Requirements

The minor in childhood studies requires 15 hours of coursework in at least two different departments. Students may take up to 4 hours of practicum courses that provide experience working with children in hospitals, daycares, and educational settings. Students may also request approval to take independent study courses in any academic discipline suited to their interest in childhood studies. Students may count up to 6 credit hours toward their major. This is possible for more than one major but with a maximum of 6 credit hours per major.
